


## Raye crowned sr. citizen king


# Dog license applications at newspaper office

Dog licenses are now available through the County Treasurer's Office. The regular rates are \$8 for males or females \$6 for neutered males or spayed females. The rates for senior citizens and those with disabilities are: \$6 for males or females; \$4 for neutered males or spayed females. Seniors must be 65 years of age at the time of purchase in order to be eligible for the discount.

Dog license applications may be picked up at the office of The Dallas Post, 607 Main Rd., Dallas, between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Pennsylvania State Law requires that all dogs three months or older be licensed.
