### Black Knights boys get off to a slow start on the court

LEHMAN - With just two seniors on the roster, the Lake-Lehman High School boys basketball team has gotten off to a slow start this season. A heartbreaking loss to Montrose in the opening round of the Crossin Tournament at Wyoming Valley West left the Black Knights at 1-8 heading into Tuesday's consolation matchup

with arch rival Dallas.

"We've had a slow start for a number of reasons," explained Lehman head coach Rodger Bearde. "We're very young and we've played some very good teams in the exhibition season. We also have a lot of athletes who participated in fall sports and had a late start with the

basketball team."

However, the primary reason for the Knights' poor start has been their shooting. "We haven't shot very well from the floor or from the free throw line," said Bearde, whose team is shooting just 28 percent from the floor. "We expected to shoot around 40 precent. You won't beat many teams shooting like we have so far."

Bearde isn't totally surprised by his team's lack of success in the early going. "With such a young team, we thought we might struggle in the exhibition season," he said. "We've played some good teams and we've only had two home games. That can be tough on a young squad."

The Knights are 1-2 in the Wyoming Valley Conference Division II and Bearde hopes "Some of these guys are just now getting into the groove after the fall season."

that his team can improve throughout the regular season.

"Our exhibition schedule should help us as we get into our league schedule," said Bearde. "We hope to be competitive in our division, especially in the second half."

To do that, the Knights will continue to rely on sophomore point guard James Lyons, a returning starter and the team's leading scorer with 18 points per game.

"James is one of the top players in the league," said Bearde. "He has outstanding speed and a great desire to become a better player. He

loves the game and works hard

to improve."
Part of Lyons' desire stems from being named second-team all-conference as a freshman and playing with the Pace Setters AAU team during the summer. "He played with and against some excellent players," said Bearde. "It was like having another season and has really paid off for him. He learned what he needs to do to take his

game to another level."

Lyons also has the ability to make his teammates better. "When you play with an outstanding player, you tend to work harder to improve," said Bearde. "As we progress this season, we will also be able to take advantage of our opponents' focusing on James."


In addition to Lyons, the Knights' offense has been led Russ Mosier, a sophomore forward who is averaging 11 points per game. Mike Sudal, one of two seniors on the team, is averaging 8 points per game while junior center Matt Morris adds 8 rebounds per contest.

The Knights' lineup features the rotation of sophomores Matt Loftus and Bobby Baird at shooting guard while senior Ed Sichler sees plenty of time at forward


Other key contributors include junior center Ted Sadowski, sophomore forward D.J. Kapson, junior guard Joel Whipple, sophomore guard Dom Castrigano, sophomore center Greg Woronko and sophomore forward Eric Messerle.

"We should get better as the season progresses," explained Bearde. "Some of these guys are just now getting into the groove after the fall season."

"Everything revolves around our shooting," explained Bearde. "As we shoot better and score more, we'll put more pressure on our opponents and take some pressure off ourselves. Our young guys are still adjusting to the varsity game. As we mature, we'll get better."

### Earl Samuel inducted into Juniata Sports Hall of Fame

Earl Samuel, of Dallas, was recently inducted into Juniata College's Sports Hall of Fame. A native of Johnstown, PA and a 1961 graduate of Richland Township High School, Samuel was a four-year letter winner in both track and cross-country, he retired the record for Juniata's original 4.3-mile cross country course. In cross country dual meets, Samuel lost only twice to runners from other schools. The #1 runner for Juniata throughout his career, he finished in the top 10 at the Middle Atlantic Conference Cross Country Championship four times, including a runner-up showing as a senior. He was a

senior captain in cross country and a two-year captain in track and field, where he was the team's high scorer in 1962, 1964 and 1965. Samuel won the gold medal for the two-mile run at the 1964 Middle Atlantic Conference Track and Field Championships, breaking the MAC record at that time. He placed second in the MAC twomile in 1962, third in 1963 and second in 1965. As a senior, Samuel became the first Juniatian to win three athletics awards in the same year after being named MVP in both cross country and track and field, and receiving the prestigious Stanford Mickle
