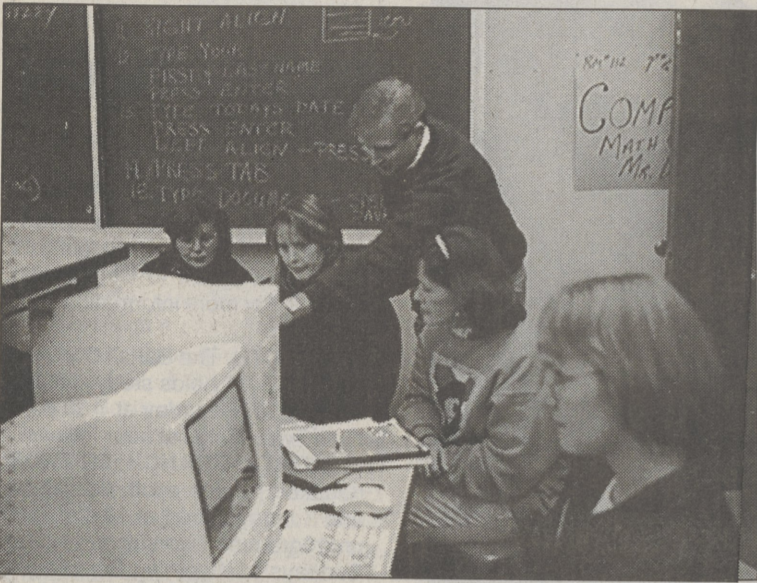


Lake-Lehman seeking host families for chorus students
