

Wyoming Sem. to hold scholarship exam Feb. 7

Area eighth and ninth grade students are encouraged to register for Wyoming Seminary's Trustee Achievement Scholarship Exam, to be held Sat., Feb. 7, at the school's Kingston campus.

The Trustee Achievement Scholarship program now, in its 17th year, recognizes leading students. Up to five scholarships will be awarded to students who combine outstanding performance on the competitive exam with a solid record of citizenship and achievement.

Students entering ninth or tenth grade who are not currently enrolled at Wyoming Seminary are eligible for the scholarship program.

The verbal class will be held on Saturdays starting Jan. 24 from 9 a.m.-11 a.m. at the high school. Math classes are on Wed., from 4-6 p.m. Please register in the Guidance Office. Parents, these courses generally cost hundreds of dollars. Encourage your son or daughter to take advantage of this free offer.

One of the questions we have been asked regarding the practice SAT on Feb. 7 is whether it will be the same as last year's test. The answer is no. Although we will replicate test conditions, this test will be a new version of the SAT. Remember \$10 entitles students to the test and seminar. Students who don't attend Dallas are welcome to register by enclosing a check made out to Dallas High

School, PO Box 2000, Dallas, Pa 18612. Be sure to include the student's name, school, grade and address (so that we can mail back results).
