Dan Irons will give all show attendees a chance to try their hand at hunting indoors, using the unique "Virtual Hunting Experience."

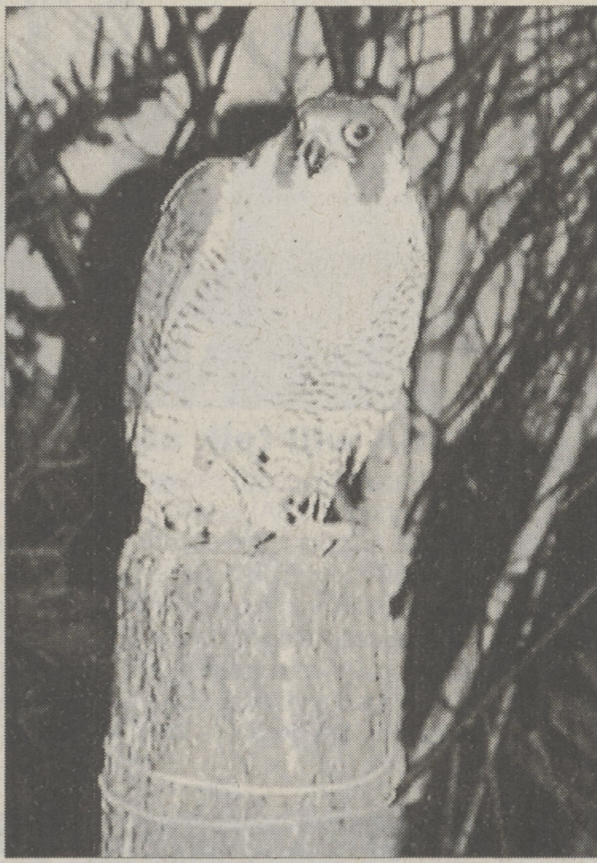
Archers from all over the state will compete in the states' largest indoor 3-D tournament with nearly \$5000 in prizes and awards.
