Notice is hereby given that Brdaric Excavating, Inc., 230 Bunker Hill Road, Wyoming, PA 18644 has made application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Mining and Reclamation, for a permit for the Back Mountain Operation to mine topsoil, spoils, and buck in accordance with Act 219, Noncoal Surface Mining Act of 1984 and Chapter 77 effective March 17, 1990 of the rules and regulations of the department.

There will be a discharge of sedimentation pond water to an abandoned strip pit, thence to mine pools, thence to the Susquehanna River.

The proposed operation is located in Kingston Township, Luzerne County, north of Luzerne and Swoyersville Boroughs on the south side of Bunker Hill (Mountain). The operation is located on the Luzerne 7.5 Minute Quadrangle topographic map, 9 1/2 inches north and 3 inches west of the bottom right hand corner of the map.

Brdaric Excavating, Inc. is also making application to the Department of Environmental Protection for approval of a blasting plan for the proposed operation. The proposed blasting schedule is as follows:

Blasting will be conducted as needed on weekdays between 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM. Blasting schedules may change due to weather conditions such as rain, snow, fog, or low visibility. Blasting schedules may also vary due to unexpected production delays or increases. Blasting will be performed within appropriately bonded areas. All access roads to the blasting area will be blocked prior to setup for blasting and until the area is safe to enter. Prior to blasting, an audible warning of three long whistles will sound. Four short whistles will be sounded after the blasting area is once again secure.
