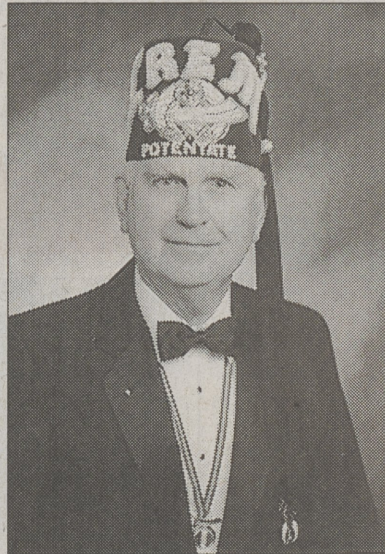
Potentate Hoover, who resides in Sweet Valley, is married to the former Dorothy Horsfield of

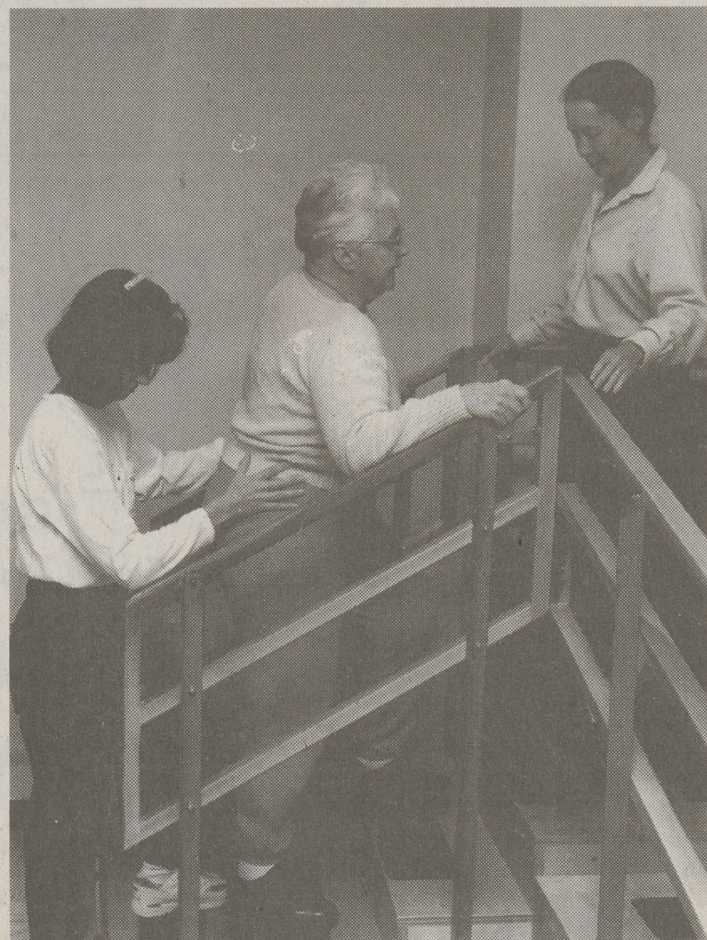
The club meets on the fourth Tuesday of each month at the V.F.W. Post 1227 in Duryea. Guest are welcome.
