Gate of Heaven tournament crowns champions in grades 4-8

The sixth annual Gate of Heaven Girls' Basketball Tournament was held during the past week. This is the sixth year for the tourney which features all of the girls' teams from the Back Mountain. The format pits four teams in five divisions, from 4th grade up through 8th grade. A total of 22 teams played in games which concluded with the championship games in each division Sunday.

8th grade

In the eighth grade division, Wyoming Valley West the was champion after a victory over Gate of Heaven by a score of 43-27. 
