Back Mountain dancers will take stage in Swan Lake

Ballet Northeast will conclude its 14th season of performances in the Wyoming Valley when it presents three full-length performances of "Swan Lake" March 13-15 at the Darte Center for the Performing Arts, Wilkes University.

This beloved and popular ballet masterpiece was not well received when it was first presented to the public at the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow in 1877. Its revival at the Maryinsky Theatre in Petrograd in 1895 finally presented the dance public with a version which has earned the enduring acclaim of the dance public throughout the world.

Ballet Northeast's outstanding young soloists, Sarah Black of Scranton and Leslie Bloss of Wilkes-Barre, will appear in a number of ensemble pieces and in the first act's elegant pas de trois with guest artist Joseph Sofranko of New



York's Juilliard School. In addition to ensemble work, Dana Behlke and Kristina Baron, Rebecca Silberman, Amy Prorock, Nicole Seitz, and Leslie Dewees of

Dallas will essay the well-known dance of the cygnets or young swans in the second act. Complementing the ballet's classical lyricism are the lively and technically

demanding folk dances of the third act. Appearing in the Czaradas and also as lead swan will be Danae Husband of Dallas.

Appearing in the principal role of Odette/Odile will be BNE's resident professional, Danielle Dorzinsky. The role of Prince Siegfried will be performed by guest artist Valeri Gontcharov of the Russian Ballet Theatre of Delaware. Artistic Director Peter Degnan will portray the evil sorcerer Von Rothbart.

Curtain time is 8 p.m., Fri. and Sat., and 2 p.m. Sun. March 13-15. 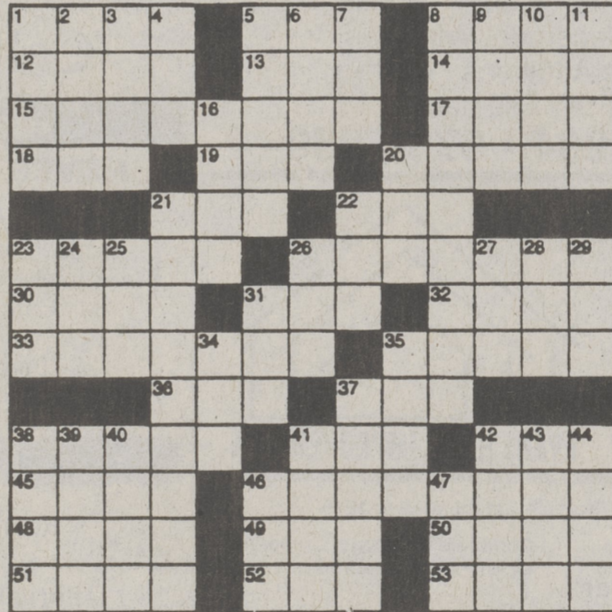

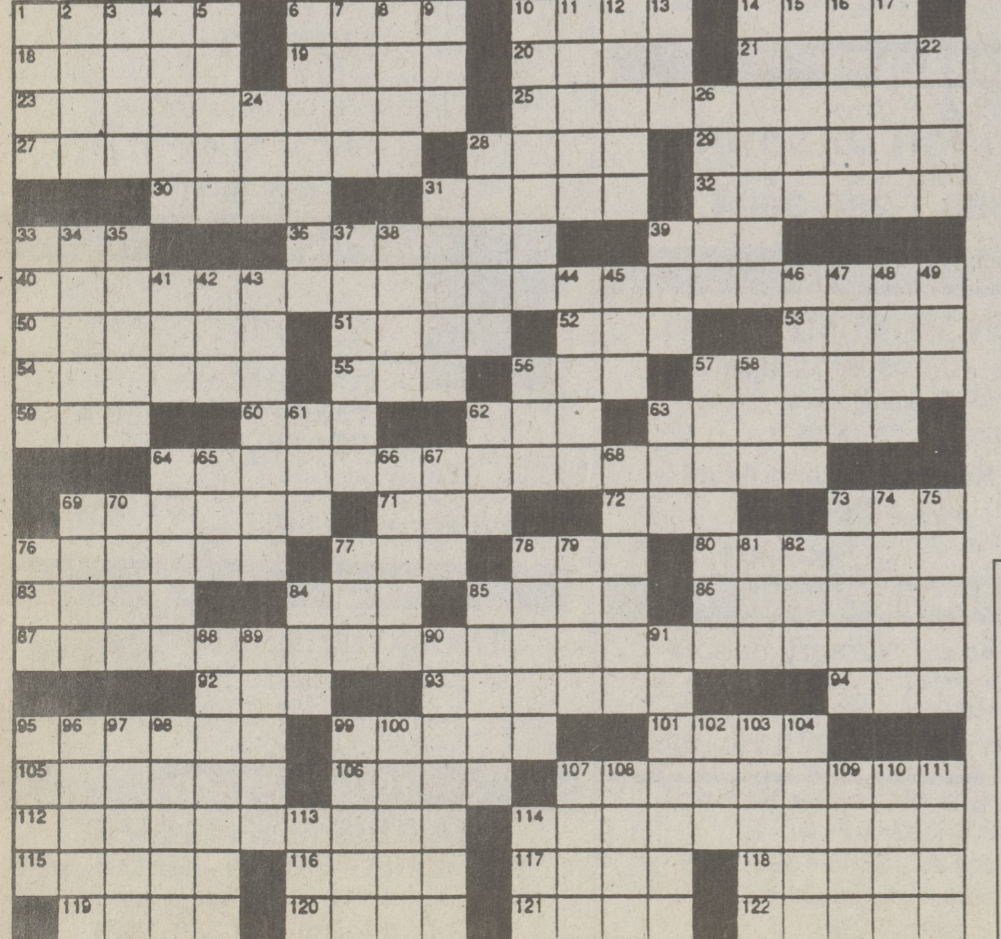

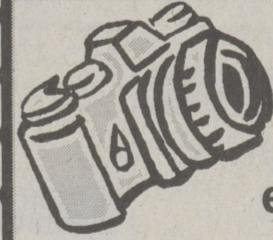
