The Fish and Boat Commission is extending the deadlines for boat registration renewals and for temporary tickets issued for new boats.

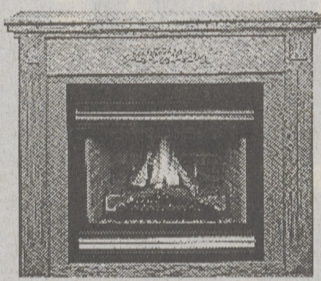
