system through West Side Vocational /Technical School (Vo Tech). The system includes software to store such items as, student records, emergency data and grade reports. Griffiths estimates the system would cost \$20,000, with maintenance costing \$15,000 a year.

Three new terminals will be installed into each building. Vo Tech is supplying new terminals at cost, said Griffiths.

"The district has not had new software in 22 years. This is a long time coming," said Griffiths.

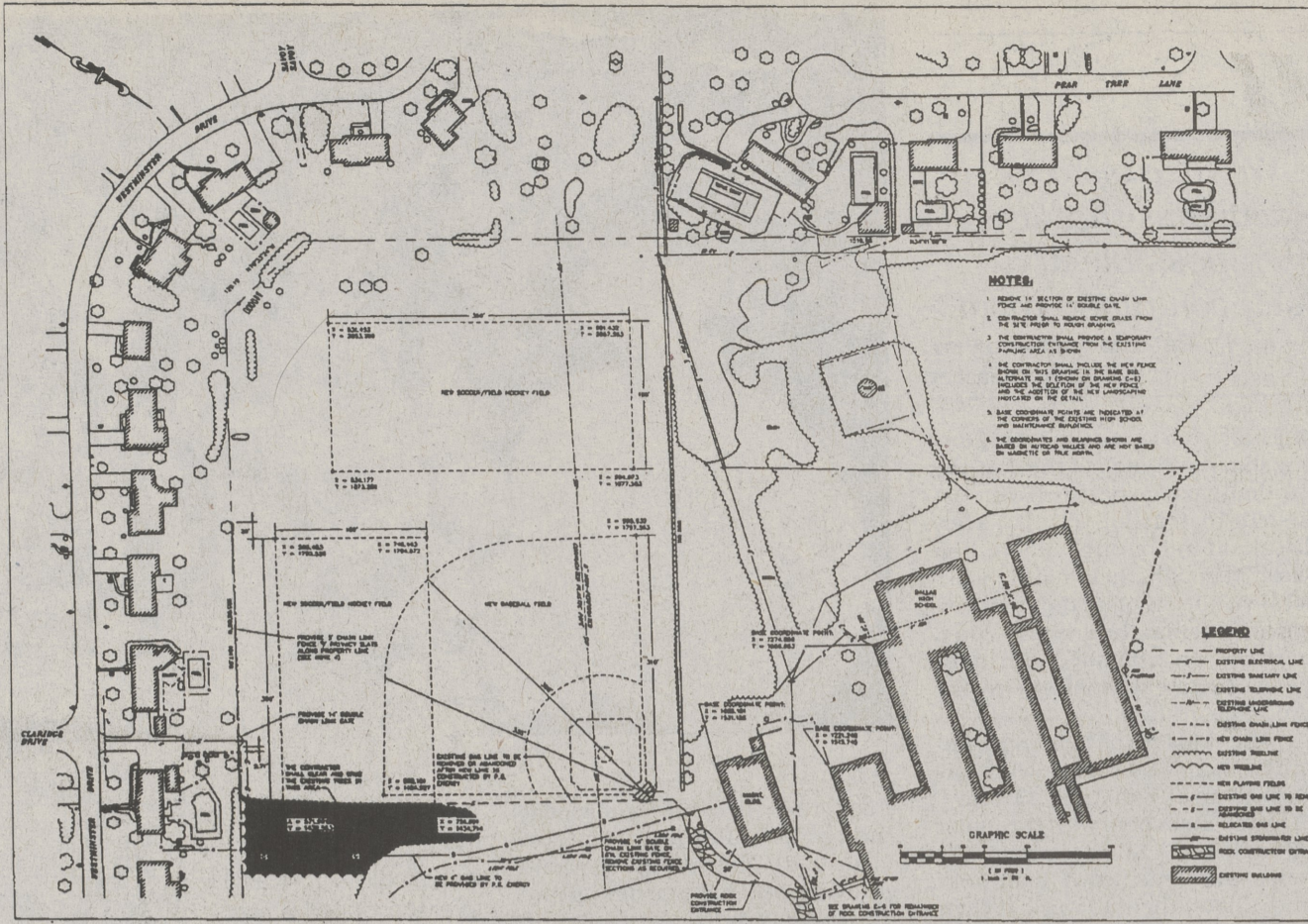
Also, the board heard from Michael Aed, a STAR Program representative. Aed told the board they would save money by signing a three-year contract with STAR. This year the district spent \$15,100 for 1,200 hours of service. Aed said, with the contract, the price will increase to \$16,000 the first year, \$16,800 the sec-

ond and \$17,400 the third. STAR, part of the Wyoming Valley Health Care System, provides physical therapy service to district sports teams. Aed said it costs the system \$35,000 to put a representative on the field for a year.

He said STAR saved the district \$16,500 in 1997 and \$19,500 already this year.

Wolensky, the athletic director, highly recommended STAR and its representative to the board. "I'm more than happy with what we have," replied Wolensky, when asked his opinion of STAR's service. "Tom Connors is very accessible. Anytime we've needed him he's been there."

Litz asked if the district could enter into a one-year contract with STAR. Aed said that it could, but that it could be more expensive. The board will discuss these issues further at its next meeting, April 20 at 7 p.m.
