

salaries, general supplies and books is \$7.6 million. "It's within \$800 of last year's budget. It's amazing," said Williams.

John Oliver, high school principal, projected a need of \$18,000 for new books. "Textbooks are becoming extremely expensive," he explained.

Oliver does not anticipate the need for additional staff, but he told the board the high school building will be at maximum occupancy by the year 2000.

Middle school principal Robert Roberts projected a need of \$8,250 for books, an increase of \$7,500 over last year's budget. "Due to the large number of students going from seventh to eighth grade, we will need 50 to 75 texts in each curriculum area," he told the board.

Roberts's request of \$3,150 for general supplies is \$2,000 less than last year, he said. The middle school does not require any new staff, but is due for updated computers, said Roberts.

"I feel if we have these positions filled we will be back to where we should be." **Robert Kunkle** Lehman-Jackson principal

Robert Kunkle, Lehman-Jackson Elementary principal, explained to the board that the elementary schools use many different materials to teach the basics. "We purchase different materials every year. It's not as simple as merely buying a textbook every 10 years," he said.

Lake-Noxen requested \$1,900 for materials, Lehman-Jackson requested \$3,600 and Ross requested \$1,120. This is \$1,500 more than what was budgeted last year.

The board will meet April 29 at 7 p.m. to discuss buildings and grounds.
