'Moon Over Buffalo' at Music Box

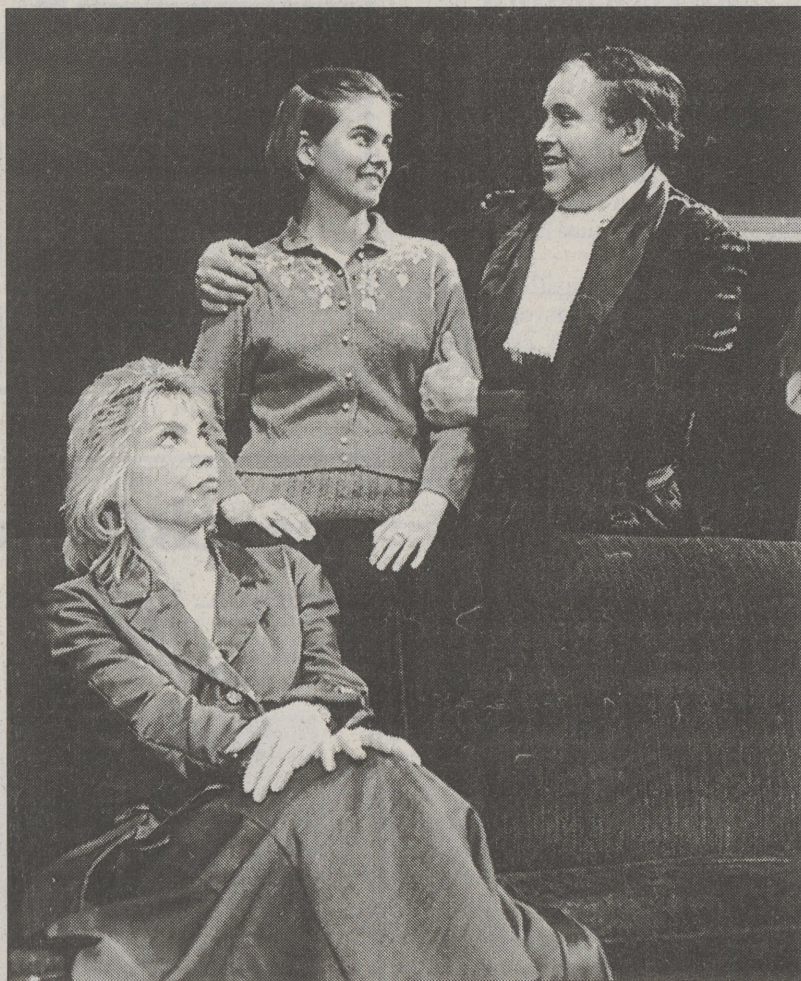
The Music Box Players will present the Northeast Pennsylvania premiere of the rib-tickling comedy: *Moon Over Buffalo*, by Ken Ludwig (author of *Lend Me A Tenor*), on May 7 to 10, and 14 to 17, at their playhouse on 196 Hughes Street in Swoyersville.

This backstage farce brought Carol Burnett back to Broadway in 1995 as actress Charlotte Hay. Philip Bosco won a tony-award nomination as her megalomaniac husband and leading man. Both are stuck in Buffalo - circa 1953 - performing *Cyrano De Bergerac* and *Private Lives* in repertory.

Fate has given these two has-been thespians one more crack at starring roles in a film version of *The Scarlet Pimpernel*, directed by Hollywood great Frank Capra, who heads to Buffalo to catch the Hays in performance. When he arrives, hilarious misunderstandings pile on madcap adventures and family squabbles, compounded by Charlotte's deaf mother. The result is a disastrous and very confused performance of *Private Lives*.

Playing the leading roles of Charlotte and George Hay are Carol Sweeney and Michael Gallagher. Debbie Zehner plays Charlotte's mother, Ethel; Rosalind, their daughter, is played by Regina Rockensies; Paul, the company manager, is played by Ron Araya; Tim Swanson plays Rosalind's boyfriend, Howard; Kelly Clisham plays the ingenue of the company, and Ted Anderson plays Richard, a friend of the family.

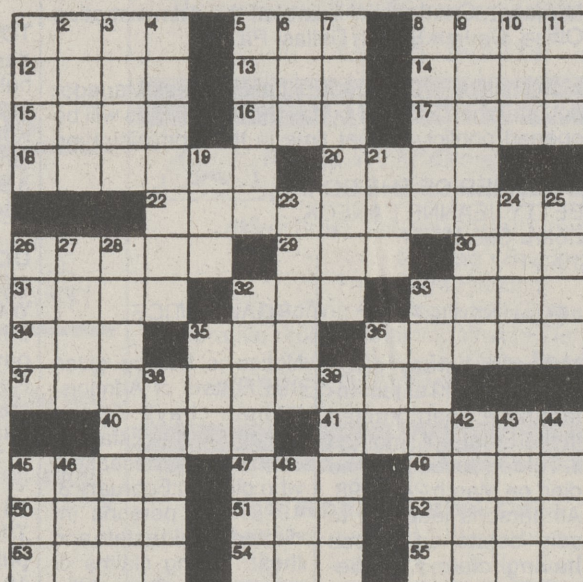

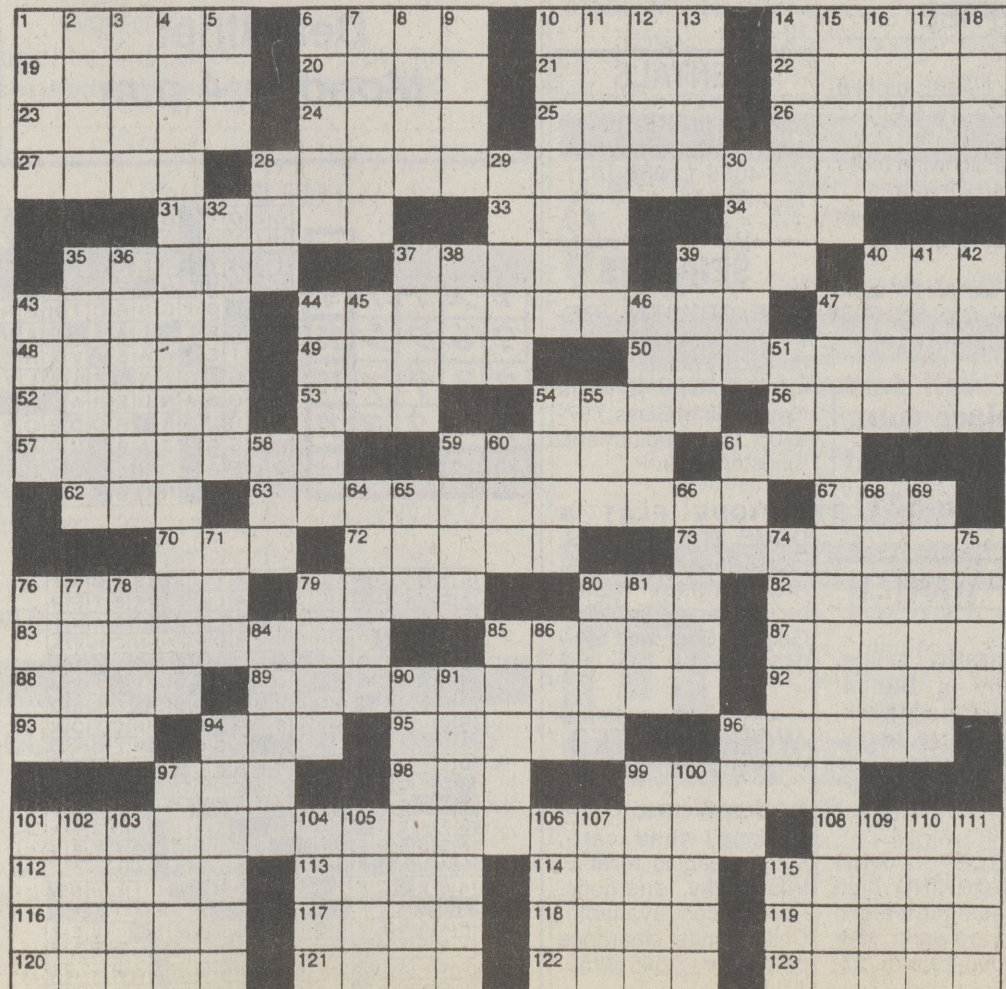

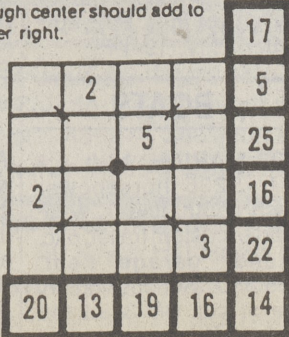
THE INTERNATIONAL CROSSNUMBER GAME
