SHAVERTOWN - Leonard S. Roginski Sr. has thought of a way to supplement his Social Security while bringing poetry to the community. He is opening The Poetry Gallery on Rt. 309, just below the Center St. light. Roginski plans to display and sell the works of amateur poets.

The grand opening will be held May 9 at noon. Many people will be on hand to open the gallery, said Roginski. Dan Gallager from Christian Television will serve as auctioneer, Mike Stevens will to an 'On the Road' story, Col. Keith Martin will discuss opportunities for disabled veterans and the PA Organization for Human Life will attend to distribute carnations in honor of Mother's Day.

Roginski wrote his first poem for his late wife, Frances, 35 years ago. It's entitled, *I Love You When...* "I have to be inspired by an incident to write," he explained. He wrote a poem entitled, *Songbirds of God* after listening to the choir on Easter Sunday. Most of his poetry is religious. "I have a strong faith. I feel the Lord has inspired me to do this. He has given me the idea to carry out my business and help me financially," said Roginski, 68.
