Township's municipal building dedicated

KINGSTON TWP. - With dignitaries, speeches and food, Kingston Township's dedication and ribbon cutting ceremony for the new municipal building was a memorable event.

On May 28, Lt. Gov. Mark Schweiker joined State Sen. Charles D. Lemmond jr., State Rep. Phyllis Mundy and others in giving their blessing to the new building and the township.

The new building stands at 180 E. Center St. in Shavertown. It houses administrative offices and the police department complex.

The facility marks the completion of a commitment by the Kingston Township Board of Supervisors to improve the township's physical plant for the next century. The municipal building, along with the expan-

sion of the Public Works Facility in 1997, combined for a \$3 million improvement project.

The building includes offices,

two conference rooms, a map room and a large records room.

"We've worked very hard to make this dream a reality," Jeff Box, township manager told a group of about 30 people at the dedication. "(The building) is a symbol of changes taking place in this community. We've all worked

diligently to complete this project." Box thanked many people including Rob Lewis and Margaret Bakker, the architects, and Borton-Lawson Engineers. Box said the project was \$90,000 under budget and three months under schedule.
