

Kingston Township Rec. Program to begin June 15

The 1998 Kingston Township Summer Recreation Program will be held from June 15 through August 7. The program is open to resident children of Kingston Township who have completed kindergarten up to and including fifth grade; but no children older than 12 years. Proof of residency, such as a tax bill or drivers license will be required at the time of registration. A \$15 registration fee will be collected at the time of registration for the first child in a family, \$10 fee for each additional child thereafter.

The summer program will be conducted weekday from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. Program participants will meet at the Center Street Park each morning. Children should bring a bag lunch and

drink each day.

Each day spent at Center Street Park will include sports, games, guest speakers, music, arts and crafts. In addition there will be several field trips throughout the summer. A reception for the artists will be held Sun., June 7 from 3-5 p.m. in the gallery. The reception is free and open to the public.

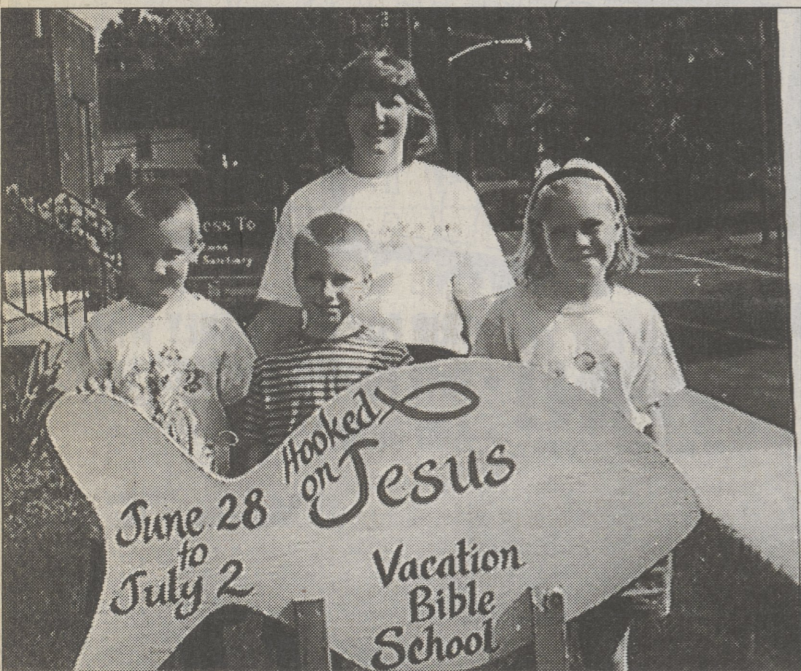
