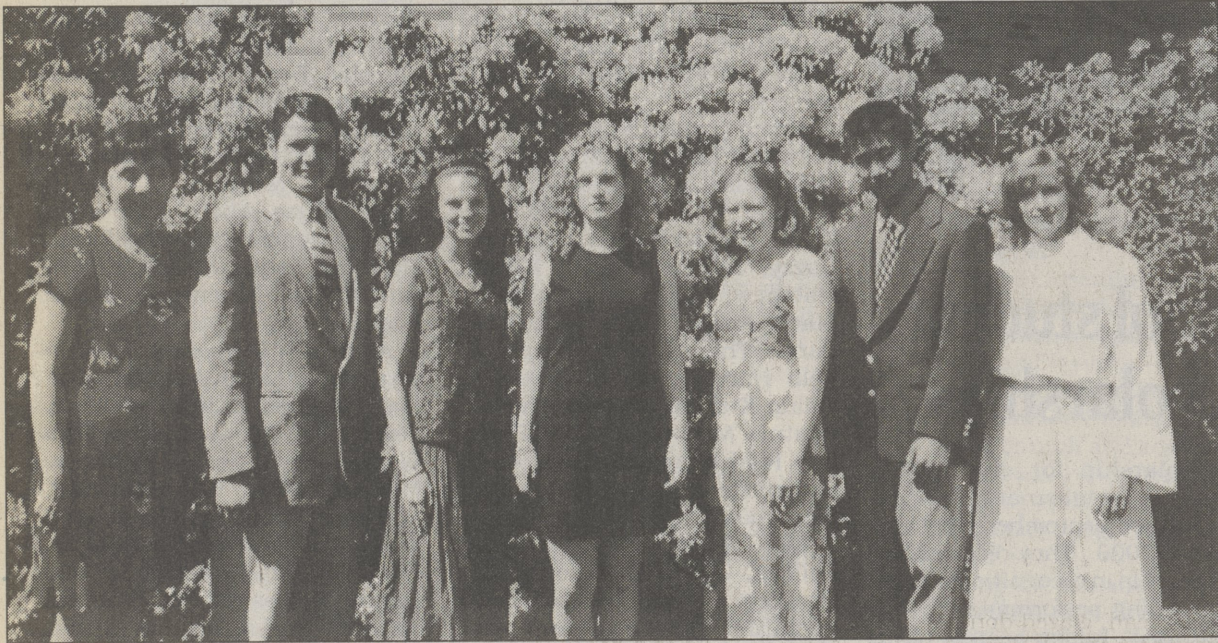
Meck to sign fishing books June 20

John Dawe, son of William and Dorothy Dawe, of Lehman has been selected to attend the Pennsylvania Governor's School for Teaching (PGST) at Millersville University, July 5 to Aug. 8.

PGST is the first and only school of its kind in the nation.

The five-week long residential program, sponsored by the Pennsylvania Department of Education, is designed for gifted and

talented high school students who are interested in teaching as a career.

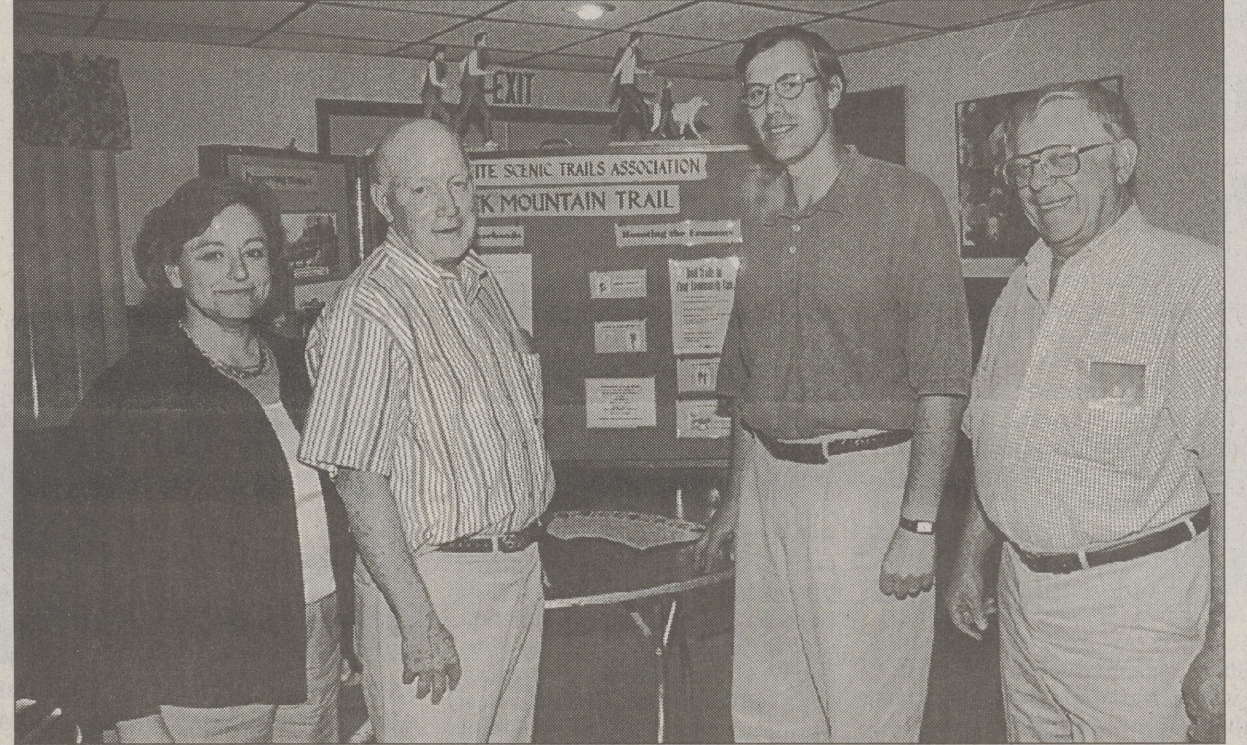
This year, 64 students were selected competitively from 300 applicants representing the 29 Pennsylvania State Intermediate Units.

They will be taught by 13 master teachers selected from school districts throughout the Commonwealth.

The program emphasizes creative thinking, problem solving and leadership skills.

Scholars teach local elementary students, create model schools and develop leadership projects to be implemented in their home schools and communities.

PGST, one of six Governor's Schools of Excellence, has been held at Millersville University since its inception in 1990.

The Dallas Kiwanis Club learned about the Anthracite Scenic Trails Association (ASTA) Rails to Trails project May 20. At a dinner held at the Checkerboard Inn on Carverton Rd., Joseph Persico of Shavertown, explained ASTA's plan to convert the old Lehigh Valley Railroad beds into walking, running and biking trails for the community to enjoy. Persico, who is campaign chairman, said ASTA needs \$50,000 to \$100,000 to finish the first two-mile segment that begins in Luzerne. He mentioned that the community can support the trail by purchasing a foot or two of the trail. "We will maintain a registry with everyone's name in it indicating who participated," Persico told the group of 30 people. Washington will be filled with small-group workshops on today's hottest issues, visits to the monuments and museums, a night at the theater and a commencement celebration.

Since 1969, Presidential Classroom has provided more than 74,000 of America's finest students with unprecedented access to Washington's halls of power and the people shaping public policy.

Alumni have gone on to be leaders in their own communities

and many, like U.S. Representative Chet Edwards (TX) and U.S. Senator Robert Torricelli (NJ) have returned to Washington as public servants.

Presidential Classroom also offers the Business, Labor and Public Policy Program, the Science, Technology and Public Policy Program and, for international students, the Future World Leaders Summit.

To participate, students must be juniors or seniors in high school, hold a "B" average or higher OR rank in the top 25 percent of their class, and show commitment to community or school involvement through participation in co-curricular activities.
