Back Mt. 20, S.Scranton 10



Oliver credits part of his success to reading a book on hitting by Phillies' Hall-of-Famer Mike Schmidt. "He talked about the theory of hitting and it has really helped me," said Oliver. "It helped me change my approach.'

Another major reason for the improvement was a technical adjustment. "I've worked hard on keeping my weight back," said Oliver. "It has really paid off. I'm making solid contact and driving the ball.

Defensively, Oliver has spent most of this season in left field. "The Reds would like me to learn all three outfield positions." said Oliver. "I feel comfortable in left. I've been working hard on my defense, especially when I was slumping."

Charleston is currently 13-24 and in last place in the South Atlantic League North Division. After finishing last during the first half of the season, a playoff berth doesn't appear to be in the cards. "We still go out and try to win every day," said Oliver. "But, the Reds' philosophy is that development is more important than win-
