

'Cut-a-thon' to aid Ricki Sue

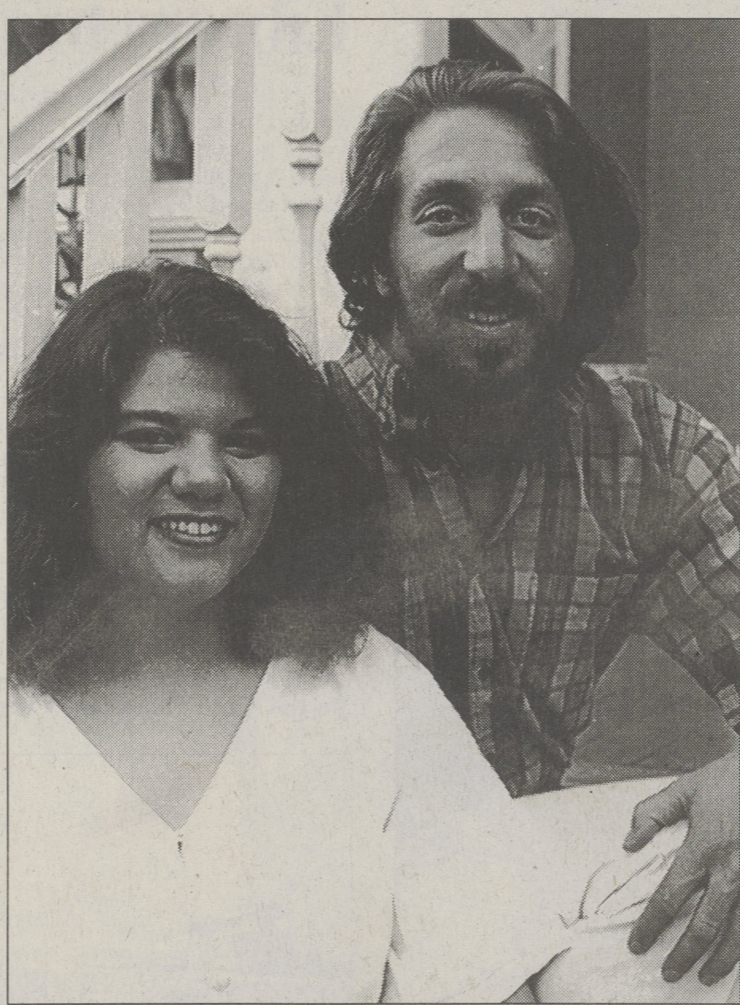

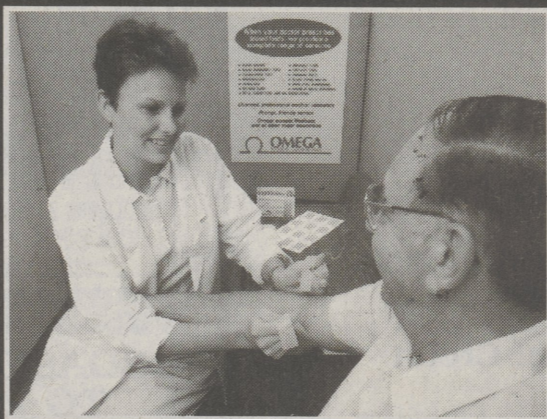
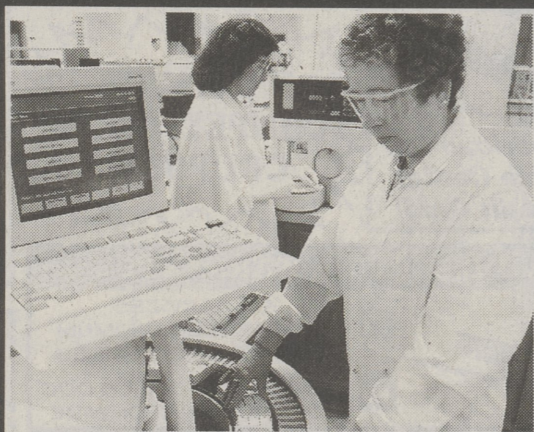
