Penn State will offer microcomputer courses

Penn State Wilkes-Barre begins its Fall '98 series of microcomputer workshops on Sept. 15. The workshops offer hands-on skill training for all levels of computer literacy from introduction to PC computing for the computer novice to programming and project management for the experienced PC user.

Windows workshops focus on efficient use of the computer platform, and software applications include Word, Excel, Access and Powerpoint. Introductory, intermediate and advanced levels of training are available in most software applications to accommodate a variety of skill levels.

Back by popular demand, the 12-week course in the Microsoft Office products offers participants computer training in Windows, Word, Excel, Powerpoint, and Access at the introductory level. This evening course is offered one night per week at the campus location in Lehman or at Penn State's offsite computer training facility at Intellacom Computer Company on Route 315 in Wilkes-Barre. A new level two Microsoft Office course focuses on intermediate skills and integration of the software applications.

on Monday evenings throughout the fall allows participants to choose among several internet. skills.

Navigating the Internet is for the new user, and Communicating Via the Internet and Using Electronic Mail (e-mail) offer communication skill training on the internet. Research on the Internet. offers training on effective internet searches, and a new workshop highlights internet security issues.

Courses and workshops are offered in project management, from one software package to another and programming in Visual Basic. One to one microcomputer training, and customized training for business and industry are also featured by Penn State Wilkes-Barre.

All "hands-on" non-credit workshops and courses are open to the general public or employees of business and industry.

Participants earn Continuing Education Units (CEU's) for their participation, and each computer training session is approved by the College of Business Administration at Penn State University.
