NEW TRUCKSVILLE GRADE SCHOOL TO BE BUILT

On the advice of Directors Andrews and May writing from Harrisburg, Kingston Township School Board voted Tuesday to accept PWA Project 2086 in the construction of the new Trucksville Grade School building. The project carries a federal grant of \$27,901, which will defray 45% of the costs of construction. Actual work on the new building is scheduled to begin on or about October

50 Years Ago - Sept. 10, 1948 **SWEET VALLEY FIRE HOUSE TO BE BUILT**

Dallas Borough Council authorized the payment of \$5,000 on its \$17,000 obligation at First National Bank Tuesday at a meeting in Back Mountain Memorial Library. The payment reduces to \$2,000 the \$14,000 indebtedness incurred few years ago to resurface streets after the WPA constructed storm sewers.

Foundations have been poured for a new two story fire house being constructed by Sweet Valley Vol. Fire Co. The building

located across the street from Church of Christ will be 30 x 37 feet of concrete block and stucco construction.

40 Years Ago - Sept. 5, 1958 **NEW BURGESS AND COUNCILMAN SWORN IN**

Hartman, a member of Board of Directors, Daddow-Isaacs American Legion; Dallas Community Ambulance

30 Years Ago - Sept. 12, 1968 **SEWAGE DISPOSAL DISCUSSED AT LAKE**

Sewage disposal action against the township highlighted the evening session of Harveys Lake Borough Council. The Sewage Commission recommended that the most economic solution to the major problems facing Harveys Lake Borough lay in joining with the Back Mountain Municipal Authority already well along in its disposal for Dallas Twp., Dallas

would eliminate vast costs in acquiring land, erecting and maintaining separate system and would lead to favorable consideration for State and Federal Aid.


