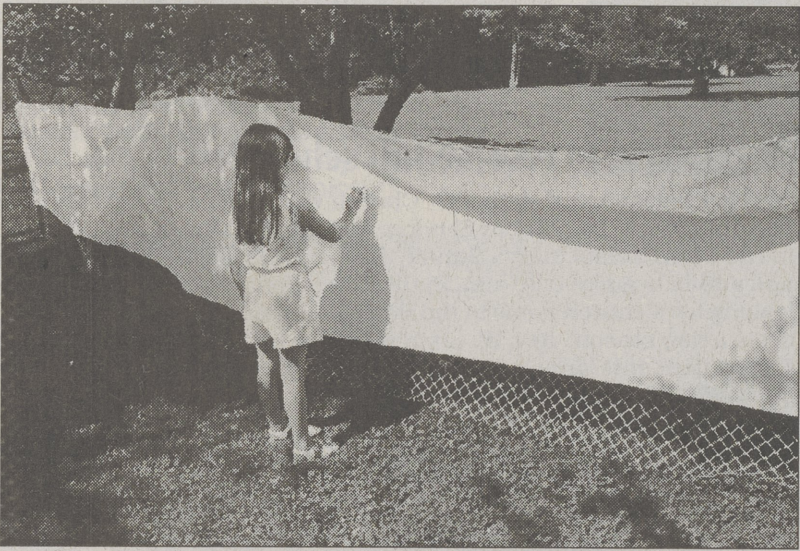


Arts in the open air

60 Years Ago - Sept. 9, 1938

NEW TRUCKSVILLE GRADE SCHOOL TO BE BUILT

On the advice of Directors Andrews and May writing from Harrisburg, Kingston Township School Board voted Tuesday to accept PWA Project 2086 in the construction of the new Trucksville Grade School building. The project carries a federal grant of \$27,901, which will defray 45% of the costs of construction. Actual work on the new building is scheduled to begin on or about October 1.

Apparently employing the up-to-date methods of auto rustlers, thieves stole 60 chickens from C. Murphy's farm at Kunkle one night this week. Chief Ira C. Stevenson, who is investigating said the thieves may have brought crates in a car and used them to carry chickens away.

50 Years Ago - Sept. 10, 1948 SWEET VALLEY FIRE HOUSE TO BE BUILT

Dallas Borough Council authorized the payment of \$5,000 on its \$17,000 obligation at First National Bank Tuesday at a meeting in Back Mountain Memorial Library. The payment reduces to \$2,000 the \$14,000 indebtedness incurred few years ago to resurface streets after the WPA constructed storm sewers.

Foundations have been poured for a new two story fire house being constructed by Sweet Valley Vol. Fire Co. The building

located across the street from Church of Christ will be 30 x 37 feet of concrete block and stucco construction.

40 Years Ago - Sept. 5, 1958 NEW BURGESS AND COUNCILMAN SWORN IN

A new Burgess to replace the late Nort Bert and a new councilman to replace Ramon Hedden who resigned were sworn in by Justice of Peace Leonard Harvey at the Dallas Borough Council meeting last Tuesday. The Burgess is Thomas H. Morgan, former secretary of Luzerne County Taxpayers Association and new Councilman is Stephen L. Hartman, a member of Board of Directors, Daddow-Isaacs American Legion; Dallas Community Ambulance

Assn. and Dr. Henry M. Laing Fire Co.

A brief but powerful thunderstorm ripped through the Back Mountain, causing downed trees and power lines. The wind broke off a section of a 28 inch maple tree, dropping it on Harveys Lake Light Co. power lines. Sixty pine trees estimated at \$3,000 were downed at the home of Charles Gansel.

30 Years Ago - Sept. 12, 1968 SEWAGE DISPOSAL DISCUSSED AT LAKE

Sewage disposal action against the township highlighted the evening session of Harveys Lake Borough Council. The Sewage Commission recommended that the most economic solution to the major problems facing Harveys Lake Borough lay in joining with the Back Mountain Municipal Authority already well along in its disposal for Dallas Twp., Dallas

Borough and Kingston Twp. This would eliminate vast costs in acquiring land, erecting and maintaining separate system and would lead to favorable consideration for State and Federal Aid.

A terrific downpour on Tuesday as kids waited to board buses at Westmoreland School prompted William A. Austin, Supervisor of Elementary Education to recommend that canopies be placed on these schools as is the practice for the secondary structures.

20 Years Ago - Sept. 7, 1978 THE DALLAS POST PART OF NEWSPAPER MERGER

Press Enterprise Inc., Bloomsburg and Pennaprint Inc.,

Dallas, today announced merger plans which will establish one of the largest newspaper circulation concentrations in Northeast Pennsylvania. Pennaprint publisher of The Dallas Post, Abington Journal, Mountaintop Eagle, Miner (Carbondale) and Midvalley Gazette (Olyphant), Western Poconos Press-Tribune (White Haven-Pocono Lake areas) and the Tri-County Journal-Adventures, all serving communities around Scranton and Wilkes-Barre.

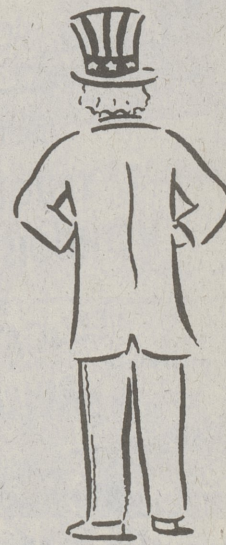
