## Wyoming Sem's Upper School to get new addition

The academic and administrative center of Wyoming Seminary's Upper School campus in Kingston, Sprague Memorial Hall has changed little since its construction in 1928.

But the sound of excavation and construction this summer heralds a new phase in the building's history.

Work began in late May on a three-story, 18,000-square-foot addition to the rear of the building, which will increase the building's overall square footage by one-third.

The Upper School's English, history, language, social sciences and mathematics classes meet in Sprague Hall.

A planning committee, composed of teachers, students and administrators, has developed priorities for the building, based on the current and projected needs of the educational program.

Academic departments will gain

six new air-conditioned classrooms as well as four departmental offices, while the school's development office will occupy a four-office suite on the first floor. A new first-floor conference room will also provide meeting space for Seminary faculty, families, alumni and administrators.

A new entrance with portico and elevator tower will provide an enhanced approach to the campus from Kingston Corners.

The addition designed by the Wilkes-Barre architectural firm of Bohlin Cywinski Jackson, will complement the campus' traditional architecture. It marks the first phase of a planned complete renovation of Sprague Hall which will include the installation of a new heating and air conditioning system as well as classroom improvements.

The \$3 million addition is expected to be completed in the spring of 1999.
