The Summer Mixer the BMBPA held at Bistro Bistro was a success. It was well attended and everyone had an enjoyable time.

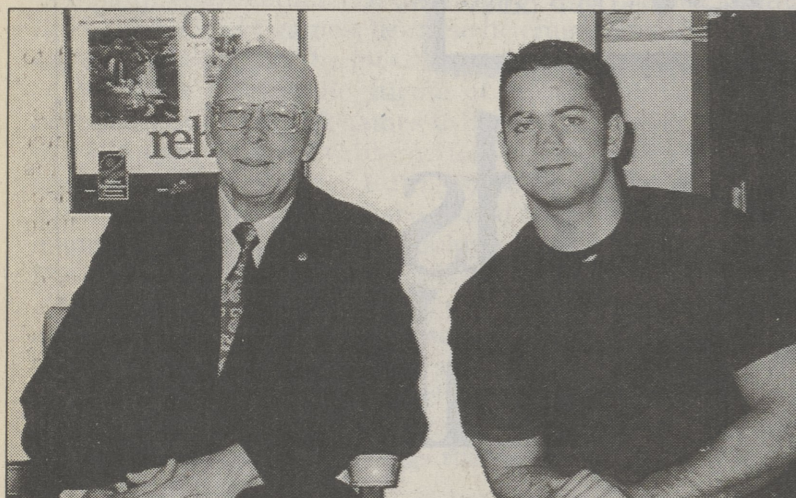

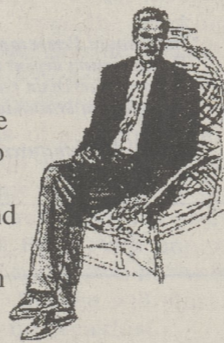
