



**KidCare identification project at fair**

The Dallas Borough Police Department will conduct its second annual Project KidCare child identification program at the Luzerne County Fair this weekend. Officer Michael Prokopchak is heading up the project, which will offer fingerprinting and photographs of children, in a standardized format that has been developed by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. A current photo is considered to be the single most important tool in helping to find a missing child. Parents can keep the KidCare identification pack for use in the event their child is ever thought to be missing. The KidCare booth will be set up from noon to 6 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 12 in a building at the fair, so it will be available regardless of the weather. In photo, officer Prokopchak took the fingerprints from Alyssa Cybulski.

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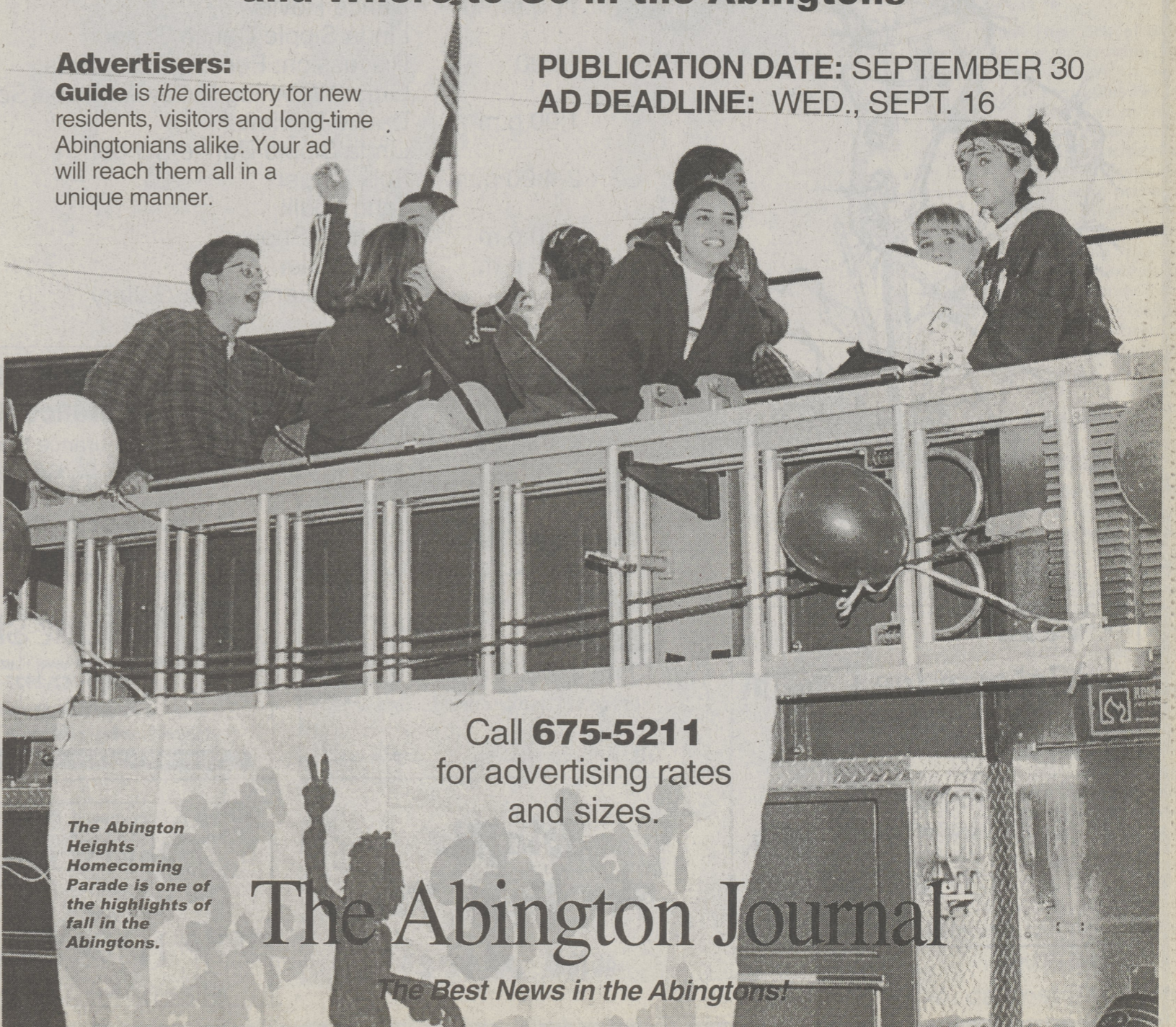
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
