It was a quick match, as Coughlin rolled 15-1, 15-5. Tara Holley led the Mounts with three kills and 10 digs.

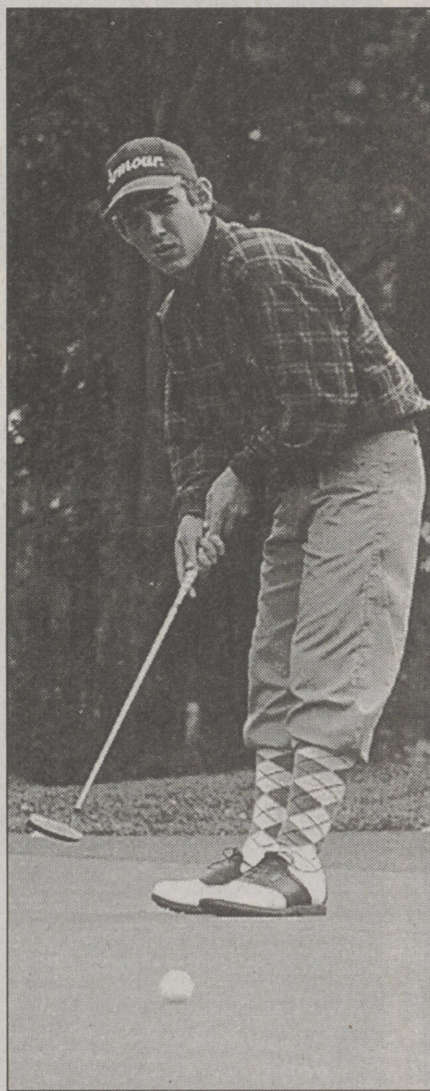
### Wyo. Area 2, Dallas 1

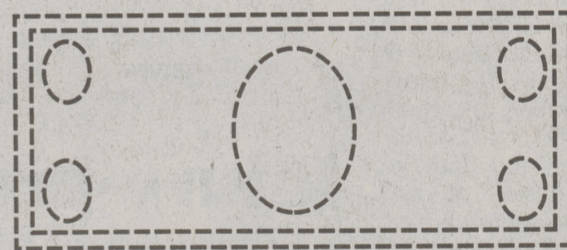
The grounds will open Friday afternoon at 5 p.m. with Native American inspired crafters and vendors selling their wares. Entrance, Friday evening, will be free to the public.
