# Get active, but don't be a 'list padder'

Applications are now available for the 1999 Governor's School of Excellence. Governor's Schools are five week residential summer programs for high school students. The programs take place on college campuses and provide handson experience in the agricultural sciences, the arts, healthcare, international studies, teaching and sciences. Room and board, tuition, classroom materials and activities are covered by full scholarship. The student's family is responsible for transportation costs and pocket money. Applications are available in Guidance.

Students should remember to try and attend the College Fair at Bishop Hoban on October 15 at 7:30 p.m. Over 100 colleges, universities, technical schools and representatives of all branches of the military will be present.

Underclassmen listen up! Colleges deeply desire active students. The student who shows a willingness to get involved is much more attractive than one who spends her whole high school career working on her Q.P.A. But students who know this fact, often make a serious mistake. They confuse involvement with volume. They think the number of activities they join is more important that what they do in those activities. They're wrong. Don't be a list padder.

That's an admission officer's term, (usually derogatory), for a student who joins every club and organization in sight so that he can list it on his application. List padders don't score very high with admission counselors. They are easy to spot. They have a long list of activities that appear impressive but below the surface, nothing. A good rule of thumb on this topic: Students who are okay in a bunch of things are not nearly as attractive with depth in one. Colleges want contributors not joiners. They want people who persevere in an activity not those who bounce from fad to fad. For example, a student who works for the school newspaper for four years, moving to a more responsible position each year, scores higher, much higher, than one who joins 12 organizations and contributes nothing. Commitment is the key!
