

be lengthened to accommodate more vehicles, about 16 total. Northbound traffic will be have a green light unless a vehicle is turning out of the used car business at the intersection.

The left turn from Hillside onto Rt. 309 has been prohibited for some months because "it takes away green time on Rt. 309.

A previous plan that would have installed a 'jug handle" turn northbound had to be abandoned because the former Harter's Dairy and a home next to it are under consideration to be in the historic register.

Shimko said construction on the \$600,000 project will take place during nonpeak hours to avoid traffic jams.




