The ordinance is designed to keep the Township streets open and clear so that snow removal measures can be effectively undertaken by the Public Works Department.

DISTRICT COURT BRIEFS

INVOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER

District Magistrate James Tupper will hear the case of Shickshinny resident Ryan M. Wido, 19, who faces a charge of involuntary manslaughter after the car he was driving struck Catrina Lemberger on Rt. 4006 Aug. 3. Lemberger, age 5, was pronounced dead by a Columbia County coroner.

Wido told police that he was driving between 40 and 45 m.p.h. in a posted 35 m.p.h. area. After an accident reconstruction by police, it was determined that Wido was driving at least 57 m.p.h. The 1988 Ford Mustang he was driving also had objects hanging from the rear-view mirror that materially obstructed his view to the front, according to police.

A preliminary hearing is scheduled for Dec. 4 at 1:30 p.m.

DRIVING UNREGISTERED VEHICLE
