For the first time, the Dallas Mountaineers, one of the perennial powers in the Wyoming Valley Conference, will meet Berwick,

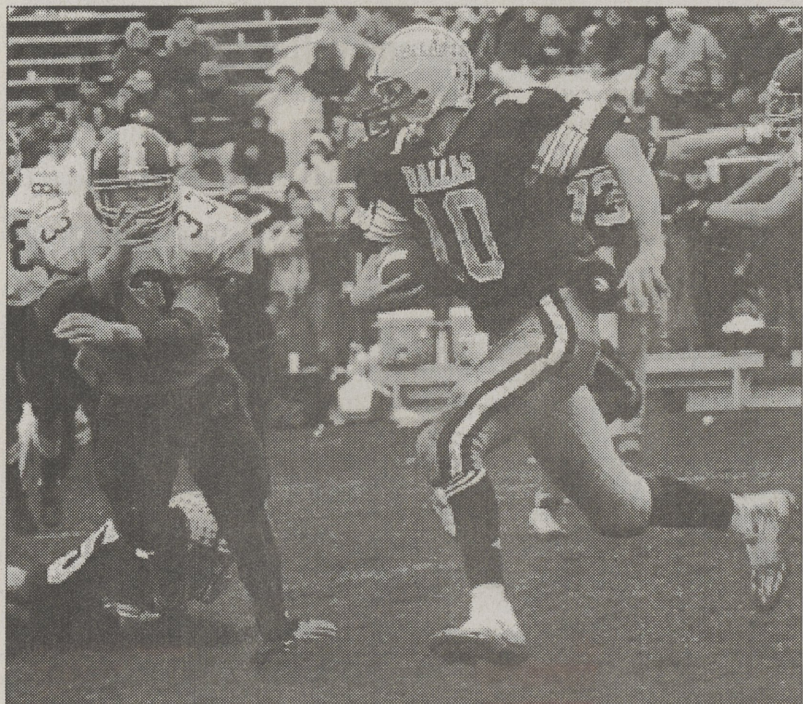

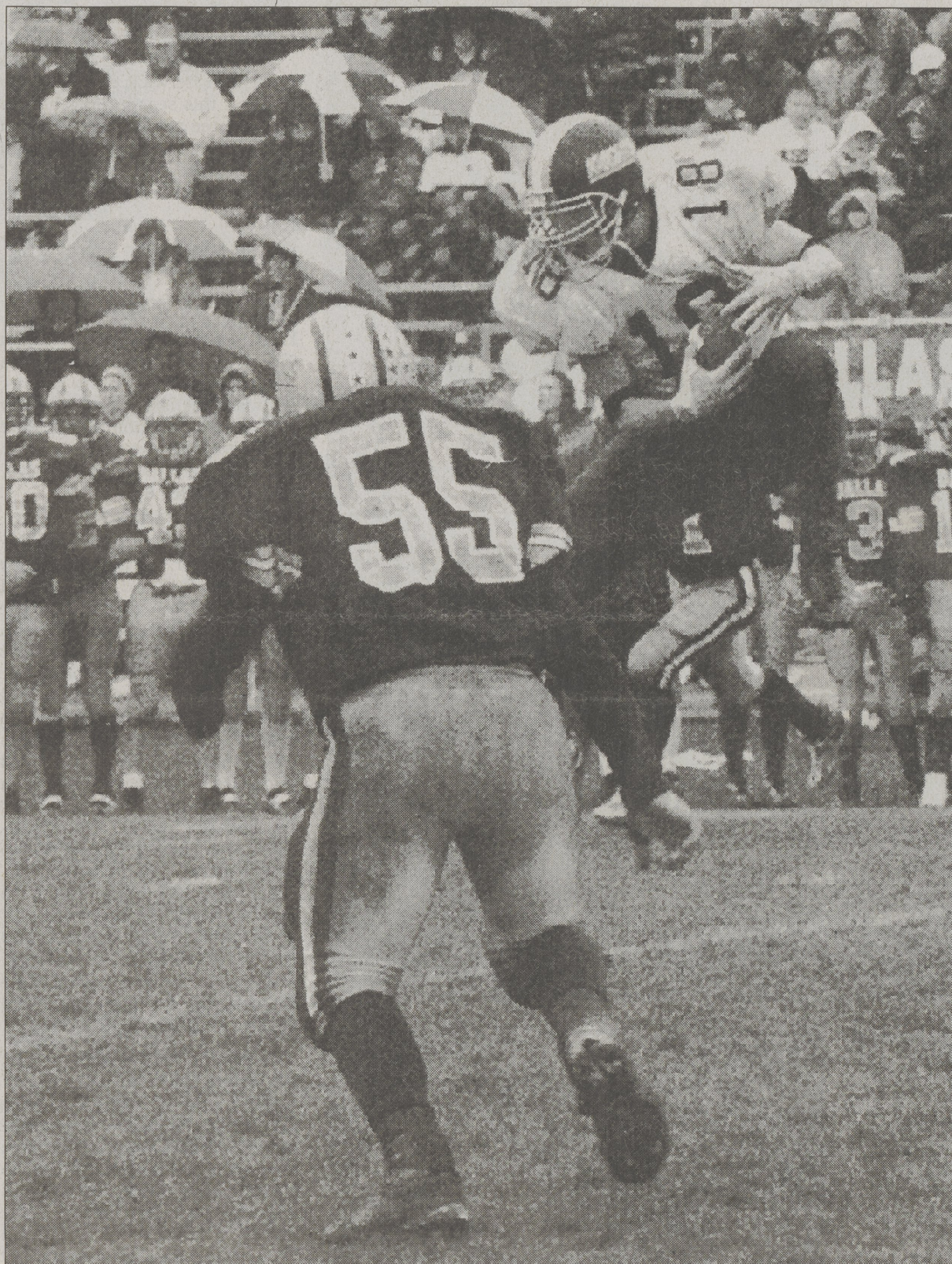

## DHS Soccer Club to hold game Nov. 28

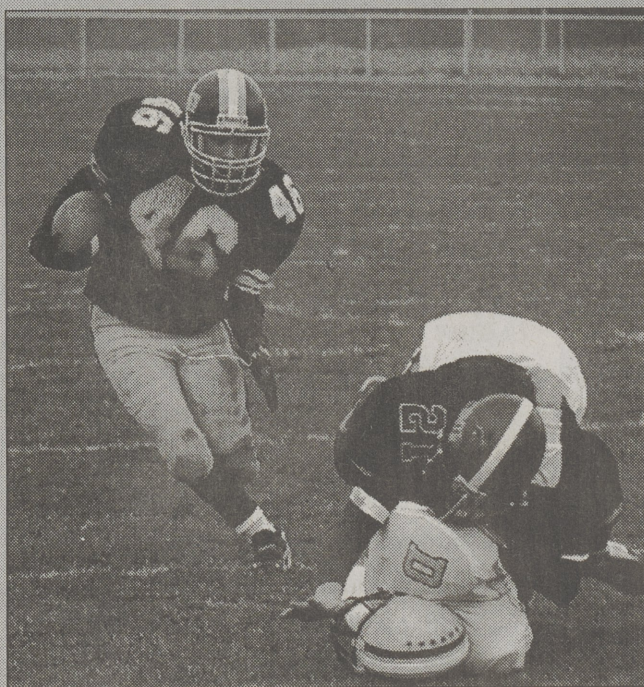
