Meadows holds party

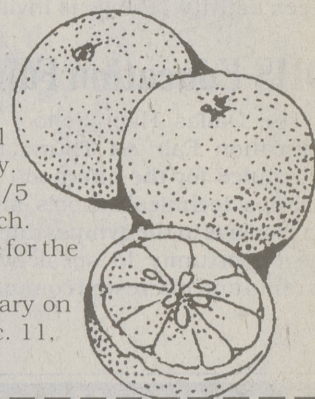

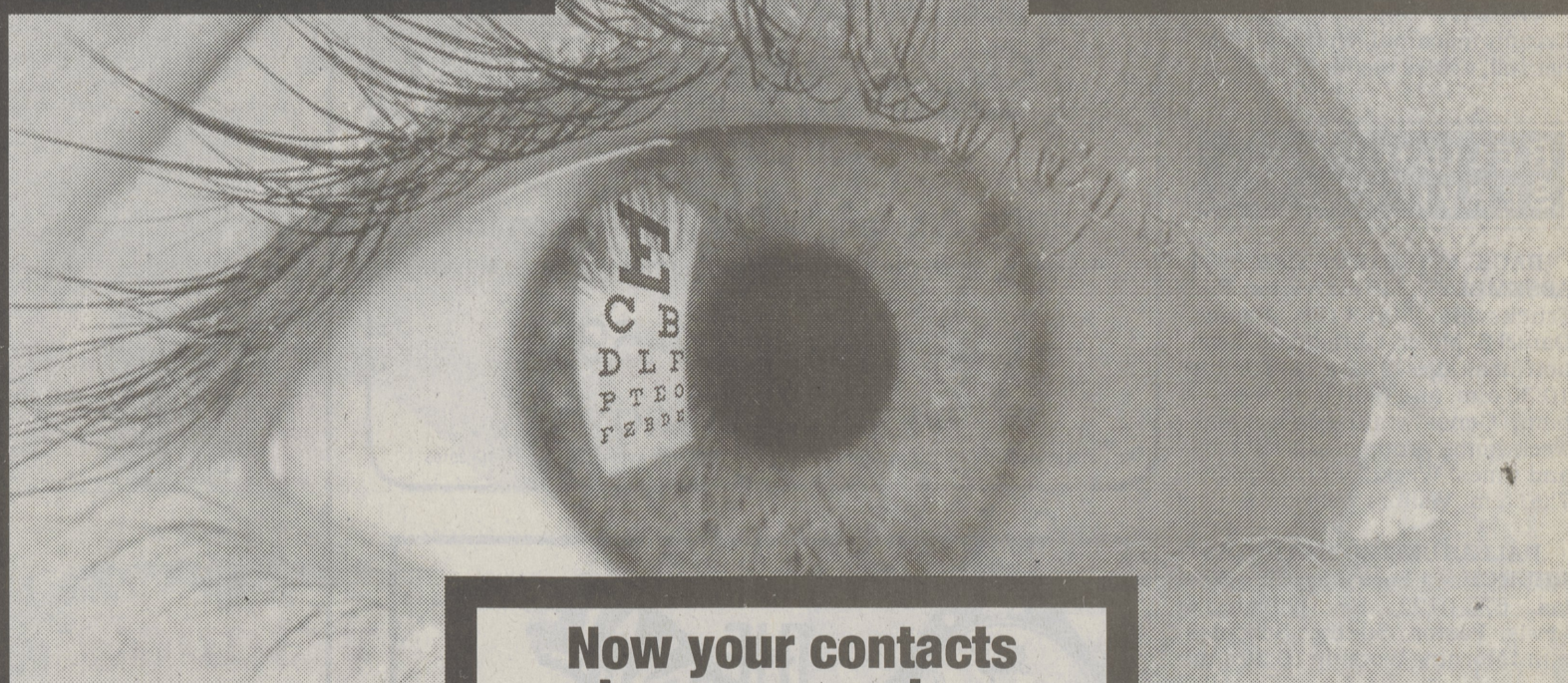
