CLEP Exams at Misericordia

College Misericordia is now a national College Level Examination Program (CLEP) site and will offer a series of CLEP examinations beginning in February, 1999. CLEP is a series of examinations that allow individuals to earn college credit for what they know, regardless of where they learned it.

College grants credits for that particular exam.

College Misericordia will grant full degree credit for several of the CLEP examinations assuming that an acceptable grade is obtained on the exam. CLEP credit is considered a transfer credit and is awarded on a credit/no credit basis.

CLEP is the most widely accepted credit-by-examination program in the United States. As a national testing center, Misericordia will administer any CLEP examination whether or not the

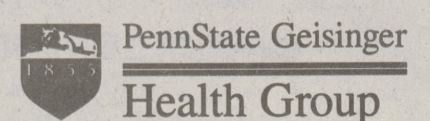
