Neutering of male cats costs \$25; spaying of females costs \$40. There is no additional office visit or exam fee. Please note that neither VCR nor Pittston Animal Hospital makes any profit from this clinic; on the contrary, we don't even expect to "break even." The sole aim is to reduce the number of unwanted kittens and cats who die on the streets or are euthanized in shelters every day in our area, and to improve the health and well-being of our clients' cats .The clinic is conveniently located on South Main Street in Pittston. Plenty of easy, low-cost parking is available at meters on the street or in the

municipal parking lot.

A cat that is spayed or neutered is healthier, better behaved, easier to care for, and much nicer to have around that one who is not. Don't wait for your cat to get pregnant, get sick or develop nasty habits, get him neutered or her spayed now, and enjoy your pet's company for many more years to

To get your cat fixed, you must call Valley Cat Rescue at 824-4172 and leave a message, any day, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. only. (Calls made outside those hours will not be returned.) 
