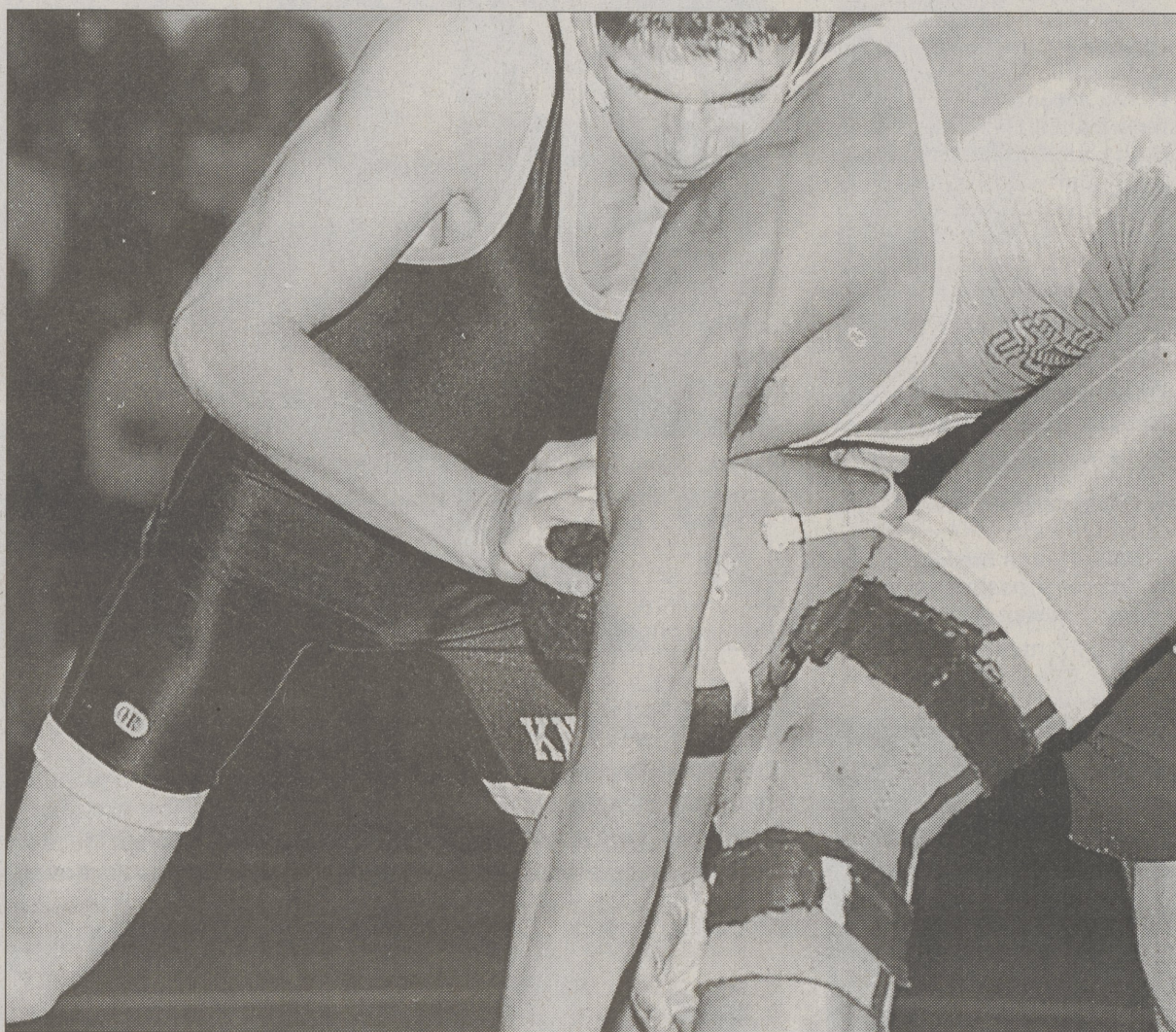
## Burger King fries Chatham Tech behind Gryskovicz's 41 points

## Pace Physical Therapy 50 - NAPA Auto Parts 37

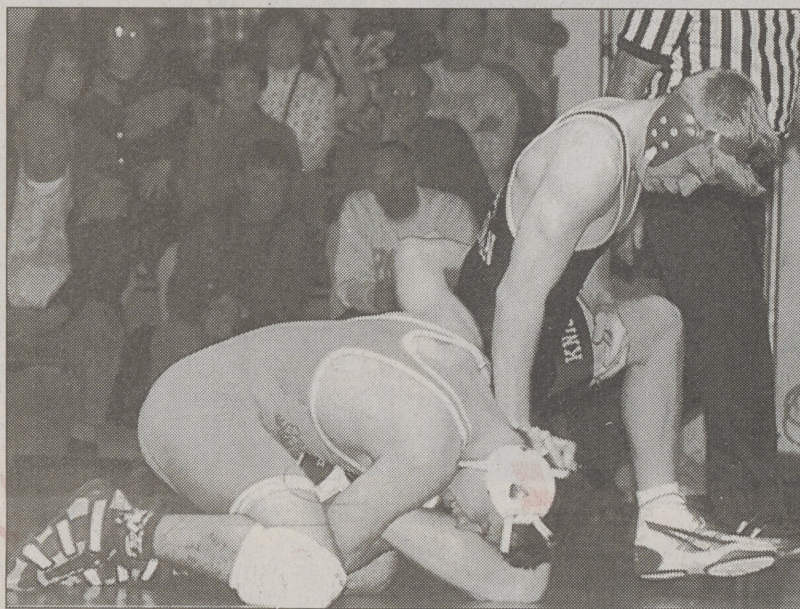

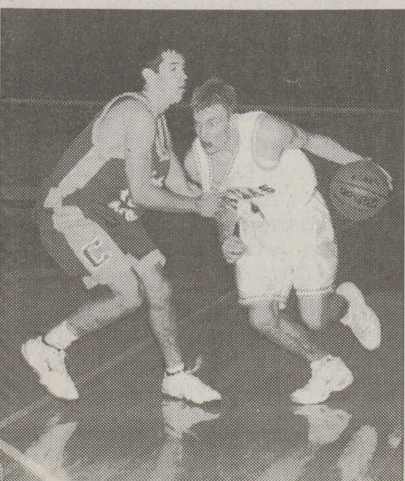
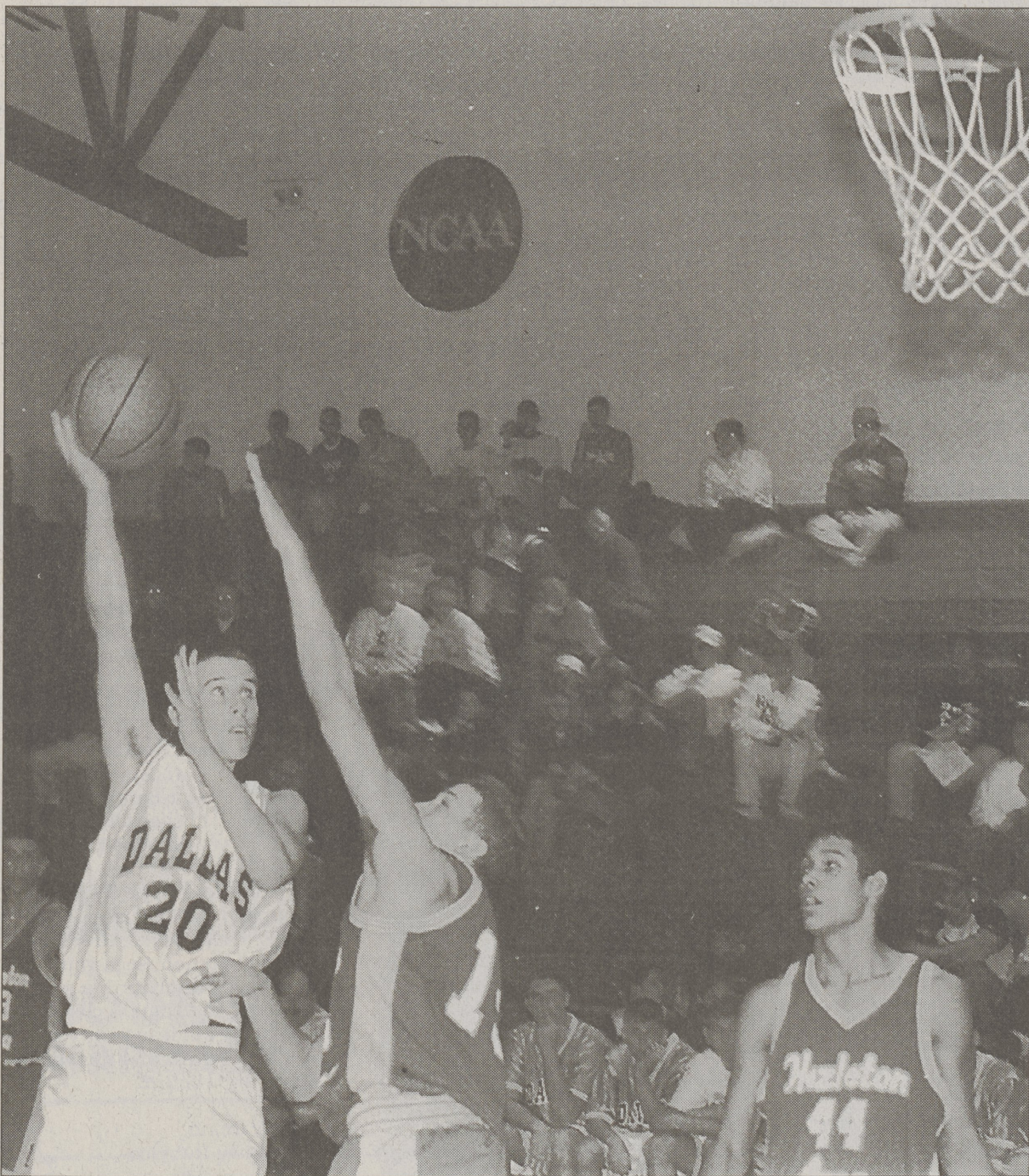
Paul Parulski two. Parulski also led the team in rebounds.

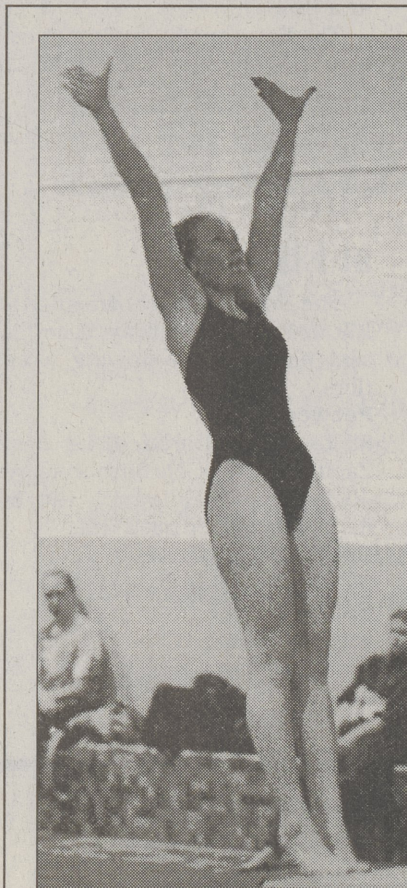
Paige Selenski led the defense.
