A medical mission comprises part of Becqui's trip. The physicians will see over 2,000 people in five days, and many residents sleep in line to assure a doctor's visit. Becqui will assist the doctors and nurses from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. every day, and then work 8 p.m. to 12 p.m. every night in the accompanying crusades. "It's not a vacation," says her mother. Becqui is responsible for ministering to people on their way into the medical tent.

During the tent crusade, Becqui will dress up like a clown to entertain children. "They teach about Christ in a fun way to capture their attention," says Becqui. "They have clowns and puppets and things that kids like.

"It's life changing," says Becqui. 'If you have a chance to go on a trip like this, go.'




