## High school students can apply for art scholarship

Students are invited to apply for a Dr. Millie S. Lawson Memorial Summer Art Scholarship. The scholarship program is open to any 10th or 11th grade student who is interested in pursuing a career in the visual arts who has not previously attended the Lawson Program.

Up to seven recipients of the scholarship will be chosen and will receive the opportunity to enroll in up to six summer art courses at Sue Hand's Imagery, 35 Main Street, Dallas. In addition, two hour group work sessions and consultations concerning career studies and portfolio preparation will be provided. All Lawson Scholars and Imagery instructors will participate in an art exhibit at the end of the summer program.

Also required are a working sketchbook plus 4-8 examples of the student's best art work in any medium which will be reviewed at a short, informal, personal interview at Sue Hand's Imagery, Dallas.
