## Bob Sherwood caps sparkling mat career

Wyoming Seminary senior Bob Sherwood recently completed his Seminary wrestling career on a high note, as he captured the 189 pound championship in the Pennsylvania Independent School Wrestling Tournament and placed fifth in the country in the National Prep School Wrestling Tournament.

Sherwood finished the season with a record of 25-4 in dual meet competition and a career record of 92-34. The captain of Sem's varsity squad in his junior and senior years, Sherwood also cap-

tured the state title last year as a junior.

Named a Levi Sprague Fellow in recognition of his campus leadership, Sherwood was captain of Sem's varsity football team, serves on the Dorm Council, and is a resident advisor. He serves as vice president of Wyoming Seminary Government, and is an active community service volunteer.
