Residents are also reminded that the township composting site is open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Wednesday from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.; and Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
