## Dallas students earn 'big bucks' in stock market game

A team from Dallas Elementary School and a team from Dallas Middle School were among the winners of the 1998-99 Stock Market Game competition conducted by the University of Scranton Center for Economic

The Stock Market Game is a 10week simulation during which students from three grade categories (4-6, 7-8, 9-12) invest an imaginary \$100,000 by buying stocks listed on the major securities exchanges (New York, American and NASDAQ). Students who

compete in the game not only learn how financial markets operate, but hone their mathematics and decision making skills as well. Separate 10-week competitions are held in the fall and spring. Team rankings are based on final portfolio values.

Teams that finished first, second and third in their categories were recognized at a June awards ceremony.

The Dallas teams finished first and second in the 4-6 grade category at the end of the spring 1999 competition.
