The "Give a Hoot" program on June 19 featured Susan Gallagher, a naturalist from the Carbon County Environmental

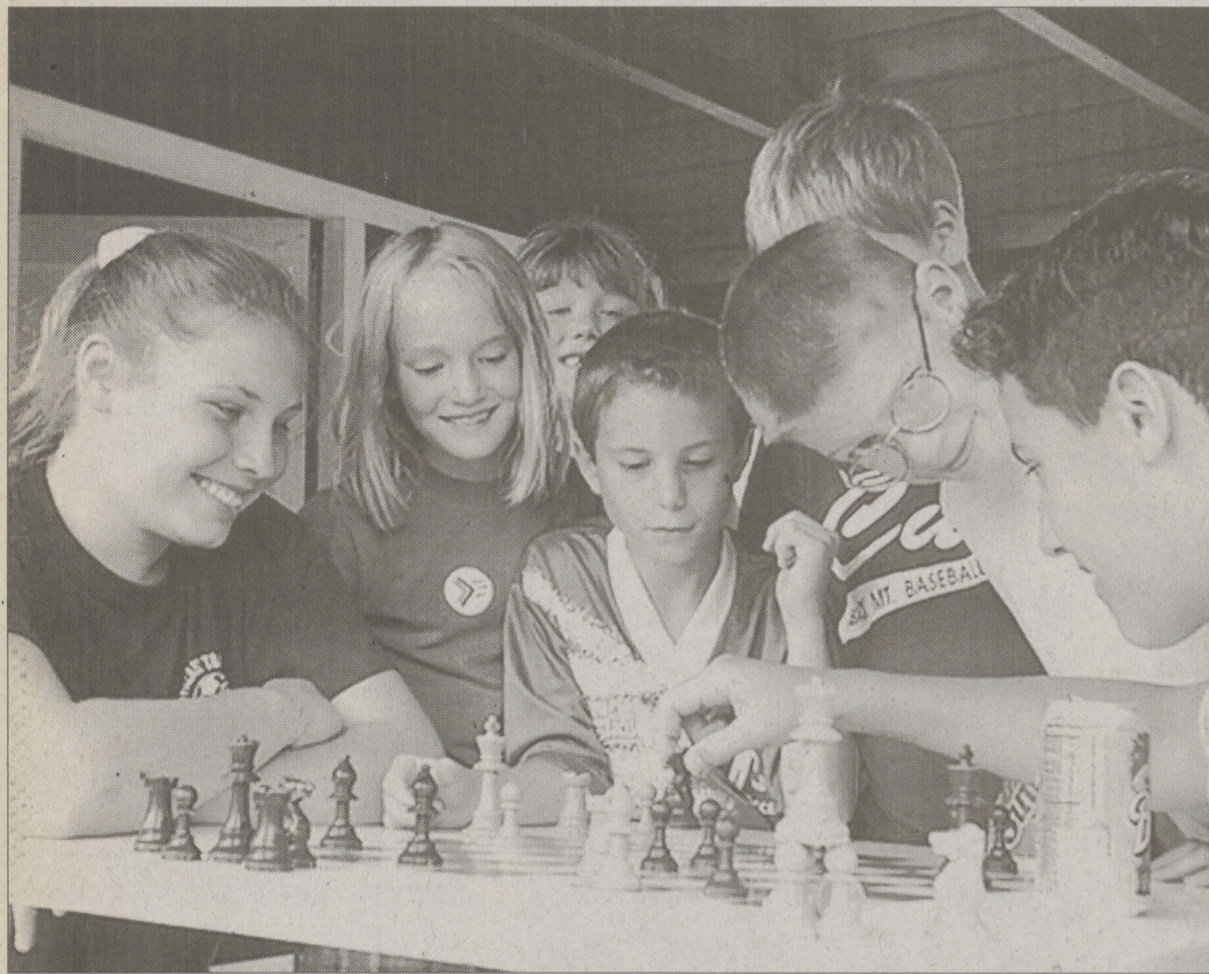
Center, who brought three live owls and presented a most interesting program about the owls' habitats, feeding, young, and nests.
