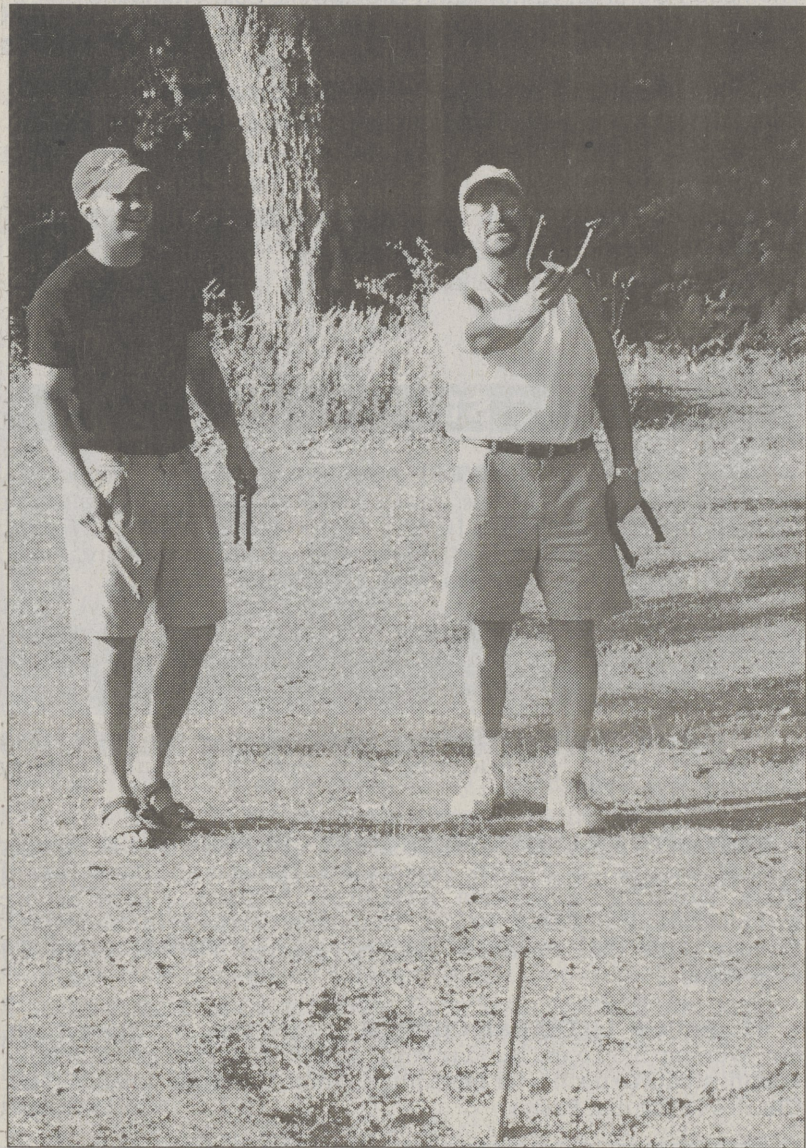
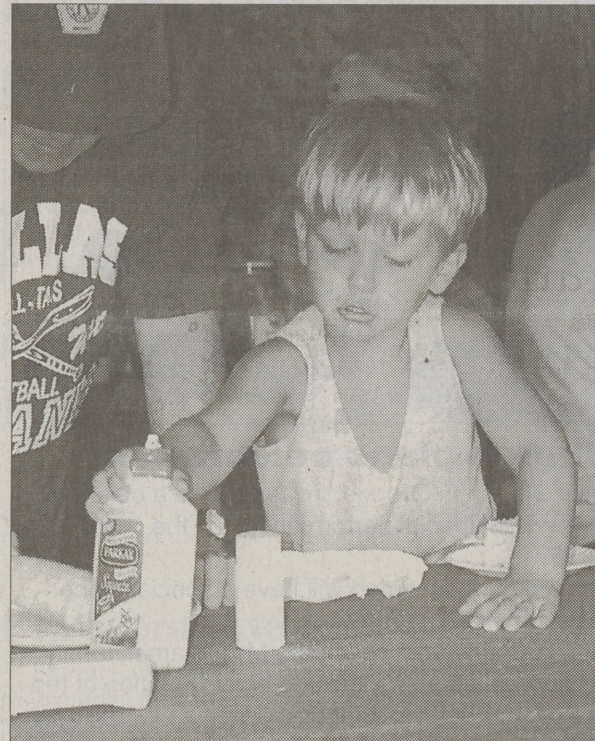


Kiwanis food 'n' fun

Misericordia adds degree programs

College Misericordia will offer two new majors, sports management and biochemistry, when classes resume on August 30. Sports management graduates will receive bachelor of science degrees and will be prepared to work for health clubs, resorts, sports teams, camps, arenas, YMCAs and YWCAs, commercial recreational facilities. The curriculum will include liberal arts courses, business courses and sports-related courses such as sports management and leadership, marketing and promotions, facilities planning and event management. Misericordia's sports management program, the only four-year program of its kind offered in northeastern Pennsylvania, will be available as a major and a minor. The bachelor of science degree in bio-

chemistry prepares graduates for graduate school and pharmaceutical and biomedical industry, as well as preparation for professional studies in medicine, veterinary medicine and related health sciences. The program combines indepth understanding of chemistry and biology on the molecular level. It is designed to meet the ACS guidelines for chemistry and the ASBMB guidelines for biochemistry, making the program highly interdisciplinary between chemistry and biology. Students in both programs will also participate in various internships which will assist them in preparation for employment opportunities.
