# Dallas district asks parents to register children early

The Dallas School District is requesting the cooperation of parents with children of school age who have not registered for the 1999-2000 school year.

It is essential that the district be informed, as soon as possible, of all new students planning to register, especially kindergarten and first grade students. Problems occur with class and school building assignments as well as transportation arrangements when students are registered late.

Parents of new students or those transferring from other schools are strongly encouraged to register their children immediately. Late elementary registrants may not be assigned to the  $pre_{7}$  ferred school building.

All kindergarten through fifth grade students are to register at the administration building. Middle and senior high students will register at their respective school offices.

Parents must bring birth certificates, report cards from the previous school, Social Security cards and immunization records. No student will be allowed to enter school without proof of the newly required immunizations. If there are any questions, call the school district at 675- 5201.
