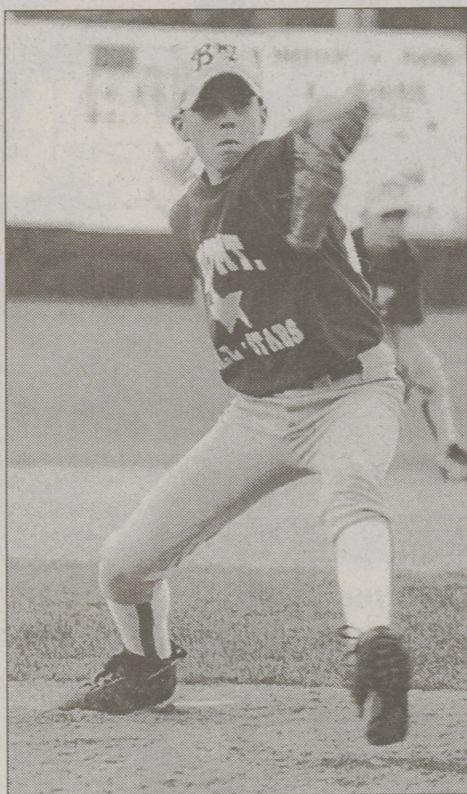

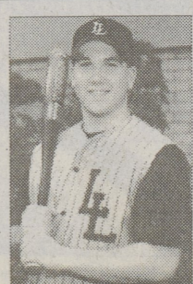
on a wild pitch (normally not allowed at this level) was permitted, a running lineup was used, and pitchers who had not pitched all season got to throw an inning or two.
