
Getting ready at the new school

Wilkes University professor of received four NASA/ASEE Sum-Chemistry and Engineering Dr. Owen Faut, Dallas, was presented with a Wilkes commemorative years of service as Secretary to the Faculty.

The award was given at a luncheon held recently in his honor. Faut will continue in his role as professor, but announced his retirement as Secretary to the Faculty in May.

Faut joined the Wilkes faculty in 1967 as an associate professor of Chemistry. He attained full professor status in 1977 and added the Engineering discipline in 1982. for a time, he also served as chairman of the Chemistry Department.

An accomplished researcher, Faut received numerous fellowships for his area of expertise. He
