The 1999-2000 school year in the Dallas School District will begin Tuesday, Aug. 31. Following is opening information for each school.

High School

Mr. Frank P. Galicki, Principal of the Dallas Senior High School, announces the high school begins at 8 a.m. and dismisses at 3 p.m. Parents are requested to consult the bus routes published in the newspapers to determine their child's bus assignment and departure points. Any concerns regarding bus transportation should be addressed to Mrs. Susan Farr, Bus Coordinator, at the Dallas School District Administration offices, Conyngham Ave., Dallas.

All Dallas Senior High School seniors, juniors and sophomores should consult the bulletin board listings in the cafeteria, and report to their assigned homerooms at 8 a.m. Dallas Senior High School freshman are requested to consult the bulletin board listings at the main office entrance and report to their assigned homerooms. Secondary students who have not registered for school should report to the building office of their respective schools.

The school lunch program will begin on August 31. The first day of school is a full-day session. Parents are reminded that student lunches for senior high school students are ala-carte.

Middle School

Sixth-, seventh-, and eighth-grade students will report to the middle school building between 7:45 and 8 a.m. Sixth-grade students, upon arrival at school, will report directly to the auditorium. Seventh-grade students, upon arrival at school, will report directly to the gymnasium. Eighth-grade students will report directly to the cafeteria. At this time, a short orientation program including assignment to homerooms will be made. Students will then be instructed to report to their homerooms in preparation for their first day of school.

To insure greater safety of student lockers, combination padlocks will be available to rent for a \$2 refundable fee. Locks will be available from homeroom teachers. Personal locks are not permitted.

Students will be able to purchase a nutritious lunch beginning with the first day of school. The price of a Class A lunch is \$1.40.

Dallas Elementary

On August 31, first to fifth grade students will be attending full day sessions from 9:10 a.m. to 3:40 p.m. Parents should consult the bus routes published in the newspapers to determine their child's bus assignment and departure points. It is requested that students ride a bus to and from school the first day to facilitate student awareness of their bus assignment and to aid the school district in maintaining accurate and comprehensive student transportation records. If it is necessary for a parent to accompany a child to school, it is suggested that the student ride the bus and the parent meet the student at the school building.

Regular student lunches will be available the first day. Elementary lunches are \$1.30, reduced lunches are 40¢ and milk is 40¢. Students may bring their entire lunch or may purchase their beverage. Snacks are available.

Kindergarten students will attend pre-arranged sessions on Tuesday, Aug. 31 and Wednesday, Sept. 1. On Thursday, Sept. 2, morning students will take buses to school and be dismissed at 10:30 a.m. Afternoon students will be picked up for a 2:15 p.m. arrival at school and will be dismissed with the other students at the end of the day. On Friday, Sept. 3, they will attend regularly scheduled kindergarten sessions.

To facilitate student room assignments, class lists have been posted at Dallas Elementary School. All students who know their assignments may report directly to their classroom on the first day. The following plans

have been made for students who have not had the opportunity to check posted lists: All 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students will report to the cafeteria. First grade students will report to the library. Teacher and parent volunteers will be available to aid students.

Wycallis Elementary

Students in the first through fifth grades will attend full day session from 9:15 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. The school building will open at 9 a.m. Student supervision will begin at that time.

On the first day, students in grades two to five will report directly to their classrooms. First grade students will gather in the cafeteria, where teachers and volunteers will assist them in finding their classrooms.

Bus routes and schedules have been published in the newspapers. Parents need to consult the paper for bus assignments and departure points.

It is recommended that students ride the bus on the first few days of school so those children will learn their bus assignment and the District will have accurate transportation records. If parents feel it is necessary to accompany a child to school during the first week, it is suggested that the student ride the bus and the parents meet their students at school.

Kindergarten students will attend pre-arranged sessions on Tuesday, Aug. 31 and Wednesday, Sept. 1.

On Thursday, Sept. 2, morning Kindergarten students will take buses to school with other students and be dismissed at 10:30 a.m. Afternoon Kindergarten students will take buses to school and arrive at 2:15 p.m. and be dismissed with other students at the end of the day. On Friday, Sept. 3, students will attend regularly scheduled kindergarten sessions. School will be closed for Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 6.

Students can bring their own lunch to school or purchase a hot lunch from the cafeteria for \$1.30. Milk is 40¢.

Youth Basketball signups

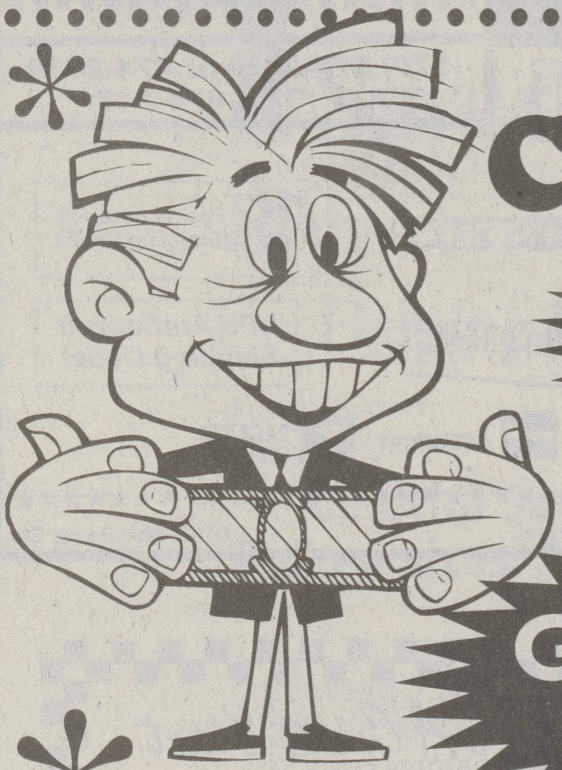
