Hank Williams III at fair

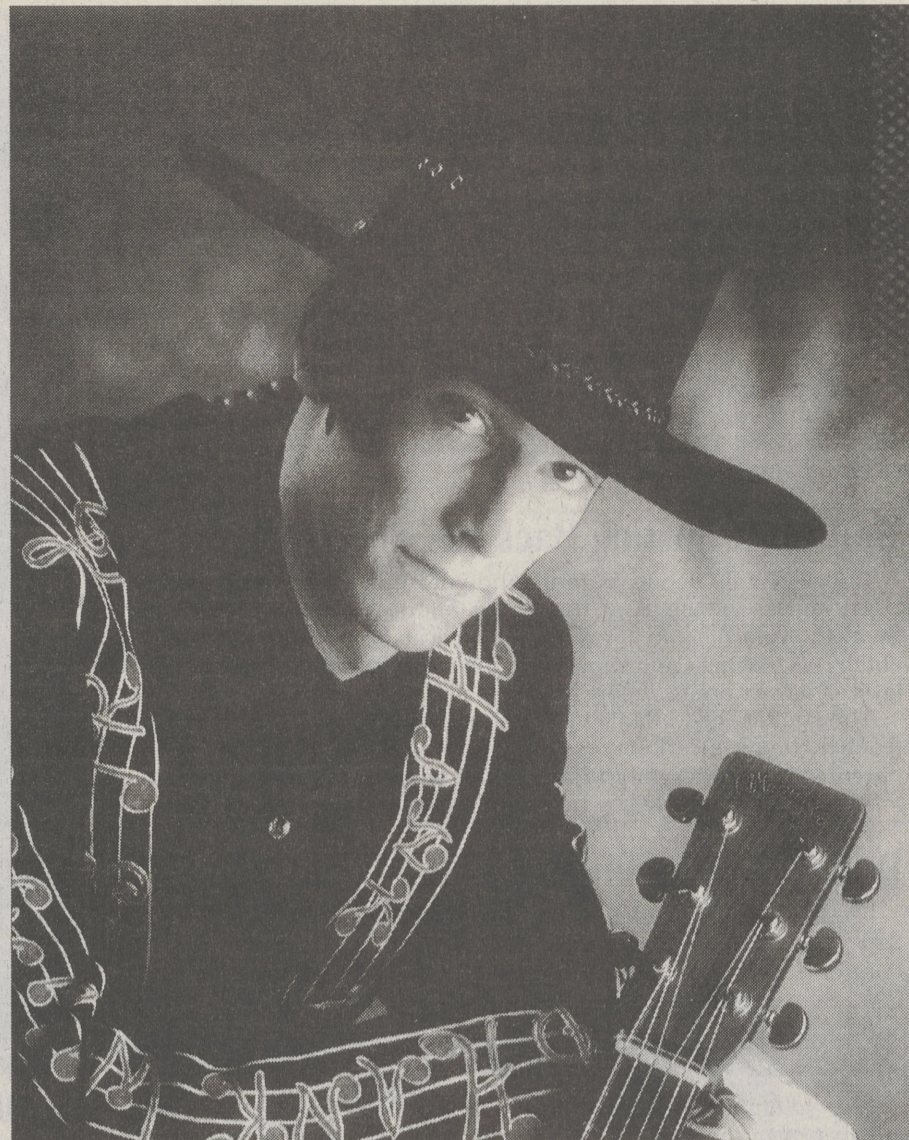

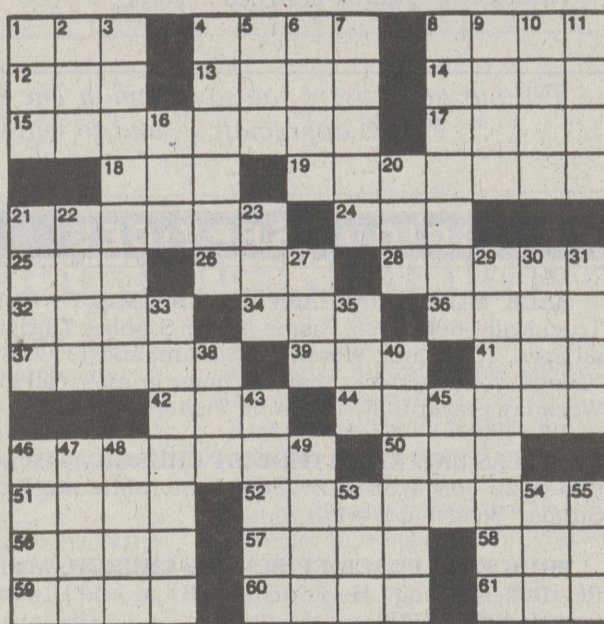
