Swetland Homestead Harvest Festival this weekend

Venture back in time with the Wyoming Historical and Geological Society at their first annual Swetland Homestead Harvest Festival. Early American craftsmen will be on hand to demonstrate their crafts Sept. 18 and 19 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, rain or shine, on the grounds of the Swetland Homestead, 885 Wyoming Ave., Wyoming. Admission is \$2 for adults and \$1 for children under 12.

Craftsmen will demonstrate blacksmithing, wood furniture creations, farm tool carving, flint lock rifle construction, chair caning and rushing, mandolin construction and embroidery.

The First Pennsylvania Light Artillery and 81st Company Pennsylvania Infantry Company K Civil War reenactment groups, will be encamped during the two-day festival. The 81st Company will show daily camp life and a military drill while the First Pennsylvania will demonstrate procedures for loading and firing artillery. The 2nd Virginia Infantry, Company E of the Stonewall Brigade will also be on hand.

The Donegal Weavers, an Irish singing group, will provide musical entertainment.

A host of contemporary craftsmen will display and sell handmade crafts including dried flower arrangements, wood creations, lead soldiers, wreaths, fabric items, handmade candles, iron and tin creations and more.
