## HL receives environmental grant

Senator Charles Lemmond (R-20) announced today that Luzerne County received environmental grants totaling \$28,895 from the state Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

Lemmond said that the Harveys Lake Municipal Authority received \$25,907 under the DEP's Sewage Facilities Planning Grant Program of Act 537 of 1966. The funding

will be used to reimburse 50% of the cost to revise the official plan for sewage systems required by Act 537.

"Although individual communities have a responsibility to prepare and update their official sewage plans, the state has an obligation to aid them in this endeavor," Lemmond said.
