The plot of the second book, *The Pilot's Wife*, by Anita Shreve, revolves around the grief of his widow after he dies in a plane crash off the coast of Ireland. As the story proceeds some surprising facts are disclosed which give the novel an element of suspense. Again, the group enjoyed reading the book, but found that it was not "meaty" and lacked character development. One member termed it "McDonald's for the mind," and others referred to it as "beach reading."

The rating of 3 was, we felt, too high in contrast to the 4 given to Falling Leaves, which may encourage us to change to a 1 to 10 scale, or discard the scale altogether!


