

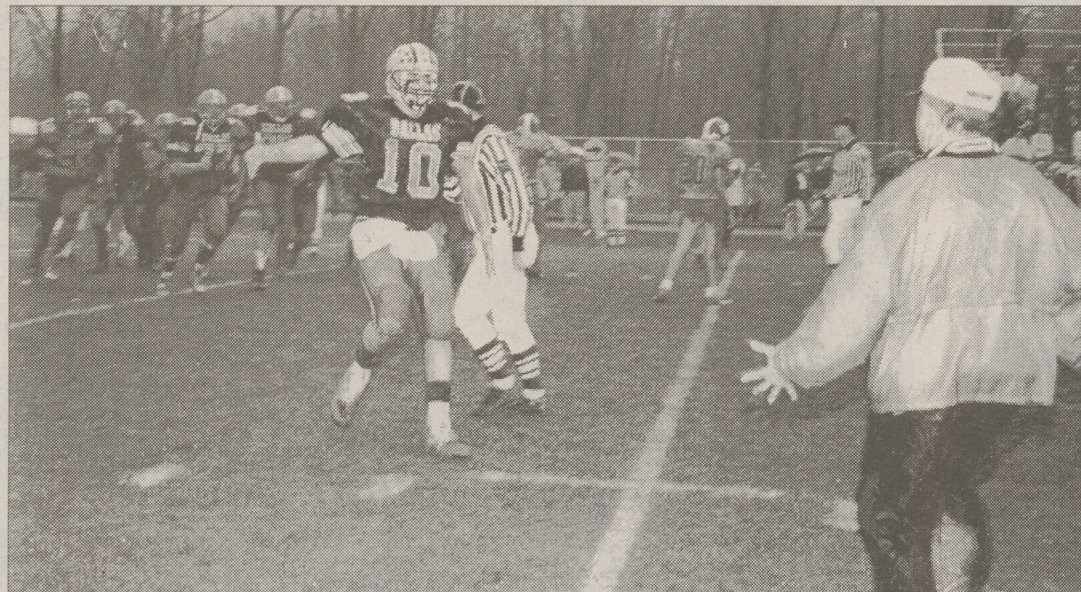
Dallas wins district championship
